State Withholding Tax Tables Effective Sept. 1

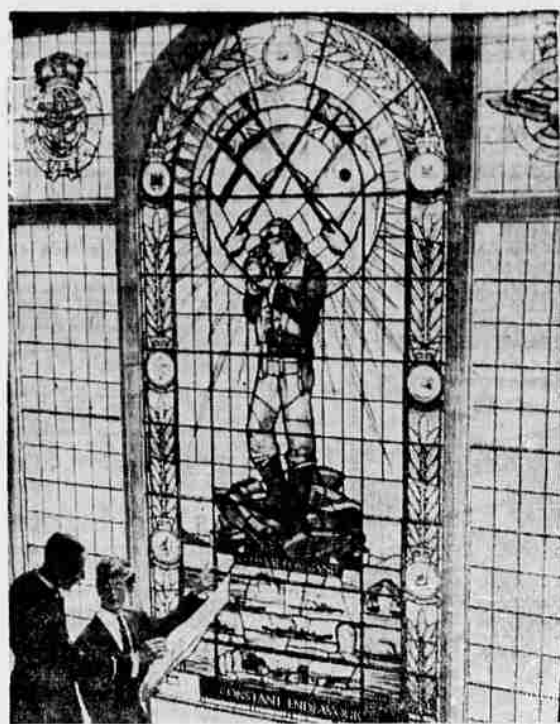
SALEM, Ore. — The state Tax Commission announced Wednesday the new state withholding tax tables that will go into effect Sept. 1.
The 1957 Legislature passed a law providing that the actual amount of the tax be withheld, instead of the flat 2 per cent rate.
