4-H Youths To Compete In Exhibits, Style Show

Youths in 4-H and Future Farmers of America clubs will continue to hold an important role this year in the county fair, which started as a 4-H activity in 1949 through 1952.

Judging and special contests for 4-H'ers will run through Saturday. The style show will be held in the new Pavilion Theater, where a runway and special scenery have been set up for the show in addition to the new seating, lighting and sound system. Scenery for the theme "Standing on the

Corner" has been built by 4-H volunteer helpers.

A special "Make It Yourself With Wool" contest is offered again this year sponsored by the National Wool Growers Assn. and the Wool Bureau. The grand prize for the national winner is a two-week trip to Europe.

Special 4-H cooking contests will be held in the demonstration kitchen in the pavilion.

The annual 4-H and FFA fat stock auction will again be sponsored by the Roseburg Rotary Club. Wait Mask will be auctioneer.

The auction is limited to animals exhibited at the fair that grade good or better. Assistance in making sales will be given to owners of animals grading below good. Hogs and lambs will be sold first and beef last. In each type, the champion animal will be sold first.

All contests are pointed toward qualifying entrants at the State Fair in Salem later this year.

A new trophy has been added to competition stakes this year for sheep showmanship by the Southern Oregon Production Credit Assn. Other special trophies are the Worthington beef showmanship award, Myrtle Creek Grange pig raisers trophy, Umpqua Rabbit Breeders showmanship trophy, Safeway Stores limited breeding project award, Roseburg Kiwanis sheep award and Roseburg Lions horsemanship award.

Board and room will be available to 4-H and FFA members who plan to stay at the fairgrounds during the fair, according to Von Borstel. Boys will be housed in a quonset hut and girls will be in a remodeled building.

Merlin Plywood Operation Faces Threat Of Strike

GRANTS PASS — A strike against the Bate Plywood operations at Merlin, nine miles northwest of Grants Pass, was authorized Sunday by members of Local 3009 Lumber and Sawmill Workers Union, according to Fred Lynch, assistant business manager for the union.

Lynch said "the strike is not yet in effect and we will negotiate as long as possible before calling a walkout."

The business agent said only Bate plywood workers, numbering between 250 and 300 men are involved in the dispute at this time and that the sawmill workers in Merlin are not affected. He declined to enumerate the grievances, but said that "about five items" were under discussion, one of them being an increase in wages.

Lynch said the union now operates under a contract with Bate which will expire in April of 1958.

C. L. Lindquist, general manager of Bate operations here, said that he will not make any statement until after a meeting with labor representatives Monday afternoon.

J. Herbert Bate of New York, head of the Bate operations, has been in Grants Pass since last Thursday on what was described as a routine business inspection of his West Coast interests.

The Bate operations here include an extensive sawmill and cold process plywood plant at Merlin. They constitute the largest single operation in Josephine County and, combined, employ more than 500 men.
