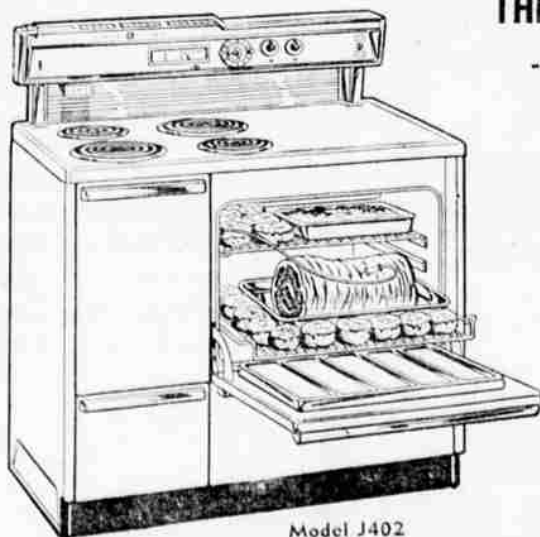

NEW BRUNSWICK, N.J. — There is no joy at Rutgers—Lucy has struck out.
