

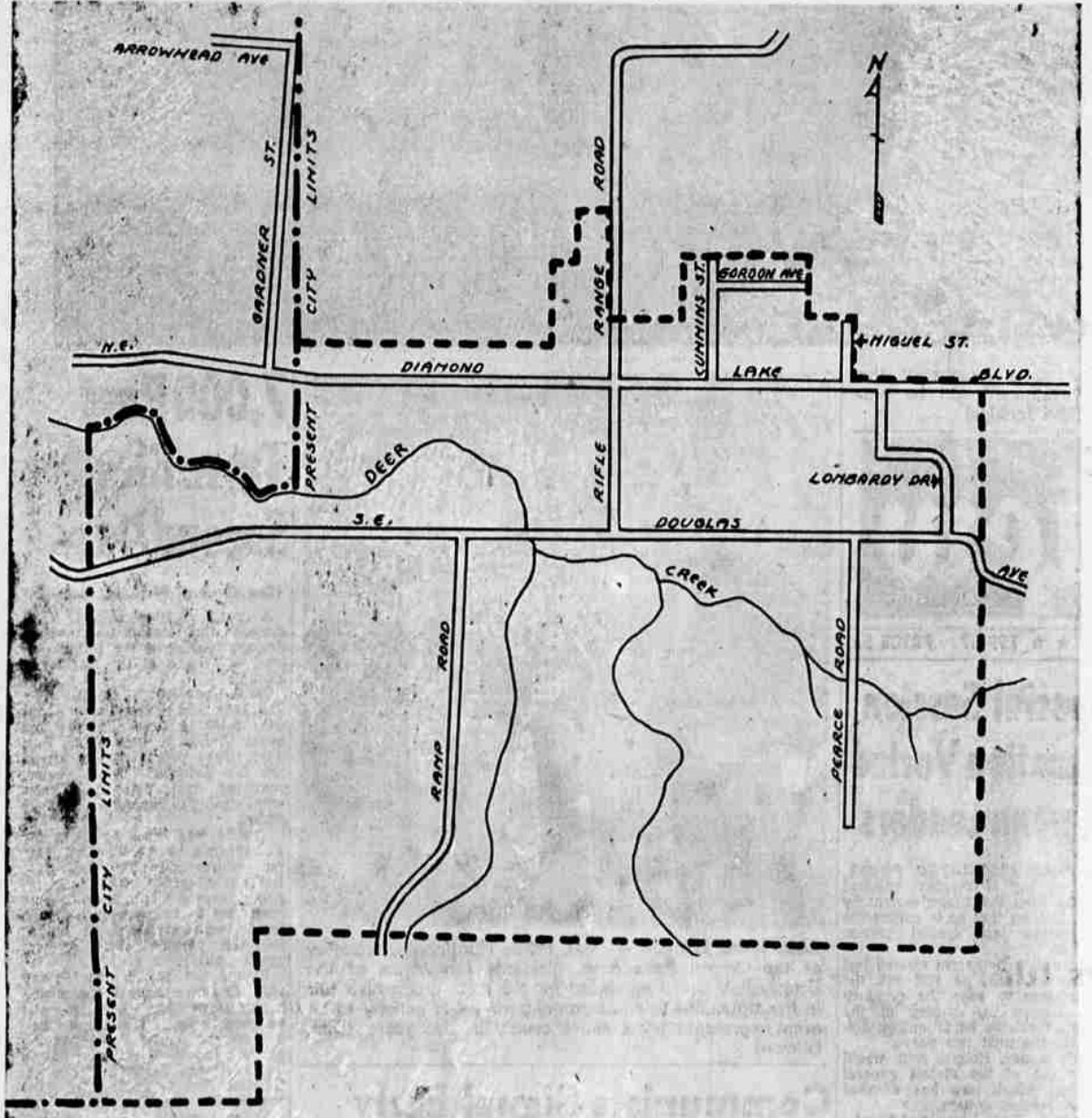
Annexation Of East Roseburg Would Require Settlement Of Tax Matters

If the voters living in that part of East Roseburg proposed for annexation should approve joining the city of Roseburg Tuesday, city officials and directors of the Roseburg Rural Fire Protection District must negotiate to compensate on taxing and property matters.

City Manager George Farrell said Friday that no city levy will be made against property in the 580.2-acre area this year.
