### Property Owners Drop Imbler St. Paving Plans

Property owners on Imbler Street, north of Roseburg and east of Stephens Street, apparently changed their minds about improving their street when they found out what it would cost. A paving job on 240 feet of the road was dropped by the county after all the property owners submitted a petition last week objecting to the improvement. A petition representing owners of at least 70 percent of the property on the street had been filed to initiate the plans for the improvement. No new petition to improve the road can be filed for one year now.

The County Court authorized the county Friday to negotiate for a five-foot right of way along 321 feet of property on Calkins Road owned by Mr. and Mrs. Eugene W. Roelle. The strip will complete the right of way needed to widen the street five feet on each side for a length of 668 feet. Calkins Road is West of Roseburg and South of Garden Valley Road.

### Confidential Trial Nears Conclusion; De Scaffa Found

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The long trial of Confidential magazine on a criminal libel charge started down the home stretch today.

Defense Attorney William L. Ritz said his rebuttal testimony will be completed next week. The case will be in recess Monday for Labor Day.

Meanwhile, in Mexico City Interior Ministry officials said that actress Francesca de Scaffa, who

figured in testimony in the Confidential trial, has been found in a suburban hideout. She was given 72 hours to leave Mexico.

Miss de Scaffa dropped from sight earlier this month. At first officials believed she had left the country.

**Attorney Testifies**

The defense case moved toward an end Tuesday with an attorney's testimony that he stopped a proposed war between Confidential and the movie industry.

Albert De Stefano, attorney for Confidential magazine, said he rejected an editorial written by former Confidential editor Howard Rushmore about a reported "Movie industry war chest to fight Confidential."

De Stefano said the editorial was entitled "Hollywood Against Confidential."

"I told Robert Harrison (publisher of Confidential) and Rush-

more I didn't think we should tackle the movie colony because it's too big," De Stefano testified. "I said as big as you are in the publishing business, you are not big enough to fight Hollywood. They'll run you out of business."

The editorial was never published, he said.

He said he refused to give approval for stories Rushmore wanted to publish about Marilyn Monroe and Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt. He said neither of the stories was authenticated.

The balance of Tuesday's defense testimony was aimed at refuting producer Paul Gregory's charge that Mrs. Marjorie Meade, one of the defendants, tried to blackmail him.

### Two Negro Teachers Hired At Levittown

LEVITTOWN, Pa. (AP) — Two Negro teachers have been hired for schools in this Southeastern Pennsylvania community of 60,000 where violent protests recently greeted the arrival of its first Negro family.

School authorities disclosed the appointments at a school board meeting Tuesday. Names of the new teachers — a man and a woman — will not be announced until school starts, in line with established practice.

One teacher has been assigned to the new James Buchanan elementary school on Haines Road, near the home of Mr. and Mrs. William Myers and their three children. The Myers were the first Negroes to move into this planned suburban town of 15,000 homes. For nine straight nights, crowds gathered in the vicinity of the Myers' house, jeering, picketing and, on occasion, hurling stones.
