

National Lumber Exchange Firm To Open In Portland

PORTLAND — Formation of a firm to be known as the National Lumber Exchange, Inc., was announced this week in Portland.

The company, with headquarters in Portland, plans to serve both buyers and sellers of lumber beginning Oct. 21.

Howard R. Baker of Portland, executive vice president, said the exchange will operate in the manner of commodity exchanges, in which buying orders are matched with sellers' offers at a price determined by supply and demand.

The exchange would not come under regulations governing cotton and corn trading, however, because the federal government does not classify lumber as a commodity.

Exchange Membership
Baker said the company would operate this way: Mill owners and wholesalers would be eligible for exchange membership. A \$5 charge per carload would be made to each on completion of lumber transactions. Mill owners would not pay membership fees. An annual fee of \$1,000 would be asked of wholesalers but a credit for purchases would apply against the fee.

Principal officers in the corporation are Fred C. Talbot Jr., San Francisco, chairman of the board; H. E. Van Allen, Whitefish, Mont., president; and Lyle Baker, Portland, secretary. Howard Baker will serve as managing director as well as executive vice president.

Most lumber industry sources here said they knew little about the venture.

R. T. Titus of the Western Forest Industries Assn. said, "It would be difficult to say at this point whether it will add anything to the industry, but added."

"It is an interesting development," he said.

Roy Janin, president of the Janin Lumber Co. and a former president of the National Wholesale Lumbermen's Assn., said the project is interesting but that the sponsors have some major problems to solve before it can be workable.

Hall Templeton, president of the big Templeton Lumber Co., said, "To date we have not yet received any solicitation to join. We know little about it and would rather

wait until we get the facts before commenting. But we certainly are interested and are keeping an open mind."

A spokesman for the Georgia-Pacific Corp. said the firm knew nothing about the exchange.

GE Salvages Large Amount Of Uranium

RICHLAND, Wash. — The General Electric Co. has said that it has completed a salvage job at the Hanford atomic plant which has added many tons of uranium to the nation's stockpile.

The uranium was salvaged from huge tanks on the atomic reservation which have been used as storage places for radioactive materials left over from the production of plutonium during World War II.

The salvage operation was started in 1952 and now is almost complete, said J. J. Courtney, metal recovery manager for GE's chemical processing department at Hanford.

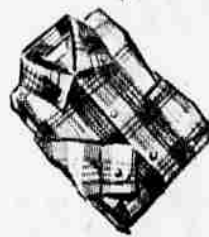

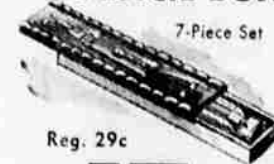
