

Board Asks Delay In Dams' Approval

PORTLAND (AP) — The Oregon Water Resources Board asked the federal Power Commission this week not to issue licenses to build two dams to the Pacific Northwest Power Co. until the board completes a survey of the middle fork of the Snake River.

The board said the survey would cost \$50,000 and would take seven months.

An FPC examiner already has recommended that the power firm receive licenses to construct the Mountain Sheep and Pleasant Valley dams.

Oregon Gov. Robert Holmes requested the state survey, saying the proposed dams would have limited storage and a "single-purpose nature."

The Idaho Power Co. also has been licensed to build three dams in the portion of the river to be studied. One of these, the Brownlee Dam, already is being built.

Attorney Hugh Smith of Portland, speaking for PNP, said his firm is awaiting only an FPC license to begin building the dams, and would proceed with construction regardless of the board's study or the board's refusal to grant state licenses.

Only 15 percent of the land in Arizona is privately owned. The remainder belongs to the government, state and federal.
