

Hunting Season Starts On Weekend

Oregon's hunting season—on a restricted basis—opens this weekend. Archers have six areas in which to hunt deer and elk starting Saturday.

The Oregon Game Commission said Thursday that archers—who are required to have tags—can't expect particularly good luck so long as the woods remain as dry as they are. The deer aren't moving about much and concentrations are in higher elevations.

The open archery areas are Canyon Creek, Mt. Emily, Eagle Creek, Baker and White River, open to both deer and elk, and Century Drive, open only for deer.

The commission said this is the outlook for upland birds. Dove hunting should be good in Jefferson County, fair in Wasco County. The doves are plentiful along the Snake River, lower Powder River, Burnt River, and throughout the Umatilla Valley and foothills as well as in Wheeler, Morrow and Gilliam counties. They are less plentiful in the Baker and Grande Ronde valleys. Blue grouse are to be found on Dooley Mountain and the high ridges of Eagle Creek and Mt. Emily and generally scattered throughout most of the Blue Mountains and foothills of the Umatilla area.

Hunters, have you oiled that shotgun? If you haven't you'd better get the job done quick because the first gunning season for 1957 gets under way the first of next month.

Sunday marks the opening of the seasons for band-tailed pigeons and morning doves throughout the state. The season band-tails will extend through Sept. 30 and for morning doves through Sept. 22. Bag limit is six pigeons per day or in possession 30 for the season, and 10 morning doves per day or in possession.

Douglas County is not well known for its pigeon hunting, but there are several places within a few hours drive that will more than give you some top shooting. Probable hot spots for pigeon shooting in the northwest include Pigeon Butte in Benton County, Cheshire and the Cushman tide flats in Lincoln County, Crawfordville mineral springs in Linn County.

The daily limit for ducks will be eight birds or 13 in possession (including in such limit one wood duck and one hooded merganser). A bag of six geese—daily or in possession will be allowed this season, including not more than three of the dark species.

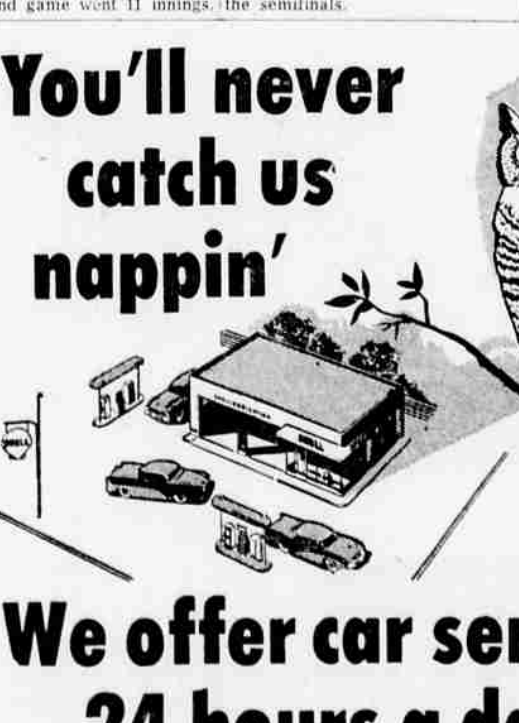
Washington Juniors In PNGA Golf Finale
