Soviet Claims On Production Are Challenged

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Agriculture Department today termed unrealistic a Soviet claim that within a few years Russia will equal or outstrip American per capita production of meat and dairy products.
An article in a department publication, Foreign Agriculture, did not say flatly the claim by Soviet Communist party boss Khrushchev would not be achieved. But it detailed reasons why this result is considered unlikely.
In a May 22 speech in Leningrad, Khrushchev said per capita milk production in the United States last year was 756 pounds compared with 540 in Russia, that American butter production was 8.4 pounds compared with 6.2 there, and that meat production in this country was 225 pounds compared with 71 in Russia.
The department publication said a number of handicaps work against a rapid increase of Soviet livestock production.

Auditor Wants Charges Dropped

VALE, Ore. (AP) — Malheur County Auditor Don Hosler asked through his attorney this week to quash the grand jury indictment charging him with accepting money illegally for services rendered.
Attorney William Schroeder asked Circuit Judge M. A. Biggs to throw out the indictment. Schroeder contended the indictment was incorrect in saying Hosler had appeared before the grand jury of his own free will.
Schroeder claimed Hosler was subpoenaed.
The grand jury accused the auditor of receiving \$50 for personal services rendered in connection with construction of the Malheur County Nursing Home last year. Biggs set argument on the motion for Sept. 13.

Industrial Rate For Gas Goes Up

PORTLAND (AP) — A 4 1/2 cents a thousand cubic feet boost in natural gas rates to some 50 industrial customers was announced this week by the Portland Gas and Coke Co.
The increase came at the same time as the supplier of the gas raised its rate 3.6 cents, the company said. Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corp. supplies the firm with its natural gas.
The new rate, which will not affect non-industrial users, is about 28 1/2 cents a thousand cubic feet. The rate applies to industrial interruptible gas.

FPC Receives Request For Dam In Washington

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Federal Power Commission here has received an application from the Washington Public Power Supply System for a preliminary permit to construct the proposed Ben Franklin project on the Columbia River in Washington State.
The dam, which the system proposes to construct eight miles north of Richland, would have an initial power output of 480,000 kilowatts. The reservoir would extend 50 miles upstream to the tailrace of Priest Rapids Dam.
A preliminary permit authorizes the holder to make the necessary studies preparatory to filing an application for an actual FPC license to construct a project.

TAIPEI (AP) — The American Embassy and Consulate will move this weekend back into the buildings that anti-American rioters wrecked last May 24. The Nationalist government paid about \$75,000 for the restoration of the buildings.

Preachers Battle Over Election

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Forces opposed to the re-election of a Chicago pastor as president of the nation's largest Negro religious group have indicated they may take the matter to court.
Dispute over the matter yesterday resulted in four arrests by police at the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc., following a chair-swinging brawl on the speaker's platform.
Dr. Joseph H. Jackson was re-elected Wednesday after he ruled a 1952 amendment lifting the president to four one-year terms was unconstitutional. He claimed his re-election by acclamation was unanimous.
But yesterday opposition forces stormed the platform and demanded reading of the minutes of Wednesday's meeting. Someone tried to remove one or two of them forcibly, and a free-for-all broke out.
