

Program Started By Garden Clubs At Vets Hospital

Arrangements for the entire program were made by Mrs. L. F. Stearns of Oakland, director of the Umpqua district.

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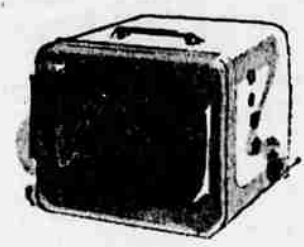
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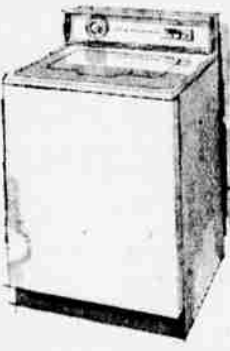
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
