'Venus Visitor' Pleads Guilty To Fraud Count

WASHINGTON (AP) — Harold J. Berney, a sign painter alleged to have claimed that he visited the planet Venus on a space ship, pleaded guilty to fraud this week. Berney pleaded guilty to fraud by wire and false pretenses. He faces a maximum of eight years in prison and a \$1,000 fine. Berney was accused of claiming that while on Venus he had learned how to produce a "magnetic flux modulator" having an energy potential far greater than that of atomic energy. He was indicted on charges of obtaining \$12,500 under false pretenses from Miss Pauline E. Gobel, a Washington secretary.
