Last Of Series Of Atom Bombs Fired In Nevada

ATOMIC TEST SITE, Nev. — The Atomic Energy Commission fired the 24th, and last, explosion of the 1957 test series at 5 a.m. (PST) Monday.

Code-named Morgan, the final shot was detonated from a balloon tethered 500 feet above the Yucca Flat desert test area.

The fiery flash was visible for a few seconds in Las Vegas, 75 miles away. Observers on Angels Peak, 45 miles from the detonation point, said the fireball lasted 12 to 15 seconds. The flash was seen in Los Angeles, 290 miles from southwest, like a momentary sunrise.

The mushroom cloud rose rapidly to 20,000 feet. It was tinged with pink after the brilliant yellow of the flash faded.

Fifteen aircraft flew data-carrying missions. The 1957 series started with a tower shot on May 28. The series of 24 included tower, balloon, rocket and underground explosions in a considerable variety of force.

The biggest, a balloon shot July 5, was believed to be in the 60 to 80 kiloton range. The underground shot set off in a tunnel dug into a mesa was small in force, probably in the 1 to 3 kiloton range, but was designed to give earthquake experts valuable data.

150,000 Peasants Stage Outbreak In Red China

HONG KONG (AP) — A pro-nationalist newspaper reported today that 150,000 peasants rioted in Chekiang Province on mainland China last month.

The Kung Sheng Daily News said the Hangchow Daily News told of widespread outbreaks against food restrictions.

The Hong Kong paper said troops put down the uprisings in Chekiang, a coastal province south of Shanghai where Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek was born. It reported 30,000 peasants in Yungku County rioted, ransacking rice stores and government stores and killing more than 20 Communist officials.

Gov. Faubus' Misconduct Charge Labeled Untrue

WASHINGTON (AP) — The White House said Monday it is "completely untrue and also completely vulgar" for Gov. Orval Faubus to say that federal troops followed girls into dressing rooms in Little Rock's Central High School.

Presidential press secretary James C. Hagerty also said that Maj. Gen. Edwin Walker had returned unopened the letter in which Faubus made the charge. The reason this was done, Hagerty said, was that it was addressed to "The Commander of the Occupation Forces."

TUMBLE KILLS FARMER

MOLALLA (AP) — A retired farmer died Monday of injuries suffered Saturday when he tumbled from a wagon while helping his family pick corn.

He was Otto Lucht. He died in a Silverton hospital.

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New Russian H-Bomb Exploded In Siberia

TOKYO (AP) — Japan's Central Meteorological Observatory reported today that the Soviet Union exploded a nuclear bomb yesterday north of the Arctic Circle in Eastern Siberia.

An observatory spokesman said the bomb was "larger than 10 megatons," a force equivalent to that of 10 million tons of TNT. U. S. experts assume that any blast in the megaton range means a hydrogen bomb.

The U. S. Atomic Energy Commission announced Sept. 22 that the Russians had begun a new series of nuclear tests. The AEC reported another explosion Sept. 8 and a third Sept. 24, the latter at a site north of the Arctic Circle.

Boy, 2, Burns Himself To Death With Gasoline

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP) — Douglas Wayne Rudel, 2, got hold of a can of gasoline in the family wash-house yesterday.

"He was bad about screwing the caps off things," said his father, Joney Rudel. "He must have just sat in the middle of the floor, unscrewed the cap off the gas can and poured the stuff all over him."

The pilot light of a water heater ignited the gasoline fumes and Douglas Wayne burned to death.

4TH QUINT DIES

TOULON, France (AP) — Roland, last but one of the Christoffe quintuplets, died today after a five-day fight for his life.

Doctors would make no prediction about the chances of survival for the remaining baby, Michele. The five babies were born Wednesday, three months prematurely, to Mrs. Camille Christoffe, wife of a social security official. A boy and two girls died within 12 hours.

Publishers, Typo Union Lose Round In Damage Suit

SEATTLE (AP) — Federal Judge John C. Bowen denied Monday defense motions in the 1-million dollar triple-damages suit of Scott Publishing Co., Inc., of Pasco, against Columbia Basin Publishers and the International Typographical Union.

The Scott company, publisher of the Tri-City Herald, is suing the Columbia Basin Publishers, published by Columbia Basin Publishers, the Typographical Union, Typographical Unit, a corporate subsidiary of the union, the union local No. 831 at Kennewick-Pasco, and others.

The complaint charges that the defendants conspired to obtain a monopoly in the daily newspaper field in the Columbia Basin.

In Monday's action, Judge Bowen denied a motion of C. C. Anderson Co., of Richland, Allied Stores Corp., and M. G. Swain, manager of the Anderson firm, to be dismissed as additional defendants in the suit.

The complaint charges that the defendants conspired with the union and Columbia Basin Publishers in advertising rebate deals.

Roger L. Shidler, attorney for the additional defendants, argued that since advertising is not a commodity it does not come under provisions of any federal anti-trust laws and, therefore, no cause of action existed.
