Scottsburg Woman Sues For Damages In Husband's Death

Mrs. Mae Van Natta of Scottsburg recently filed a complaint in the Douglas County Court against the E. K. Wood Lumber Co. in connection with the death of her husband, James.

The suit contends that the lumber company was allegedly responsible for the death of Van Natta and asks for \$125,000 in damages. He was killed June 11, 1937, near Reedsport.

According to the complaint, Van Natta, a dump man for the E. K. Wood Co., was allegedly unloading saw logs from a truck and trailer at the lumber company's log pond near Reedsport, when one of the logs became disengaged from the load on the side opposite the dump and rolled on him.

The E. K. Wood Co. is charged in the complaint with allegedly not using proper safety measures and neglecting to comply with sections of the safety code for logging and the basic safety code for the State of Oregon, in connection with Van Natta's death.
