

Roseburg Bowler Assaults Record

A Roseburg bowler, trucking operator by occupation, has undertaken the task of breaking the national record for consecutive games bowled.

He is Bus Eaton, who at midnight, last night, began the marathon which, if successful, will continue at the Roseburg Bowl lanes until about noon Sunday. The national record is 261 games and Eaton embarked on the record-breaking trail at a planned pace of averaging some five games per hour for 60 hours.

Ahead of Estimate

At this rate, he was to have bowled 60 games by noon today and 120 at the 24-hour mark at midnight tonight. At the latest check at 7 a.m. Friday he had actually bowled 42 games in 6 1/4 hours, which represents a pace considerably ahead of his estimates.

At the end of 40 games, he was averaging 179.

The present national record was set in 1921 by a bowler who rolled 261 consecutive games over a period of 60 1/2 hours without interrup-

tion. According to local alley manager Arlo Jacklin, the information on the record and on Eaton's attempt at the mark were disclosed in a telephone conversation between himself and national headquarters of the American Bowling Congress in Milwaukee, Wis., this week.

Watching Eaton

Jacklin added that the name of the bowler or place where the present record was set were not immediately available. But he said that the national office of the ABC is watching Eaton's assault closely.

Eaton said he believes that by averaging five games an hour he can break the record and establish a new mark of 300 games in a period of 60 hours. That's what he's shooting for anyway.

The Roseburg man is an average bowler, by way of league scores in pin-topping. He has been averaging about 170 this year and finished with a 153 mark last year. He will use a 16-pound ball and a scorekeeper will be in attendance throughout.

Whitworth To Play Despite Flu Bout

SPOKANE (AP)—Whitworth College decided Wednesday to go ahead and play the scheduled game here this week with the College of Puget Sound despite a flu outbreak on the team.

Coach Wally Uphoff said only 14 of his 35 Whitworth players were still ailing and that he expects all but about half a dozen to be ready for CPS Saturday.

Uphoff had 19 flu-bitten grid-ders Tuesday and the school considered postponing the game. While ailing players recovered and returned to the squad, others dropped out and joined the sick list.

"It was in and out, just like free substitution," Uphoff said.

Washington State and Oregon see a chance for a Rose Bowl bid riding on the outcome of their Pacific Coast Conference game Saturday at Pullman while California, Southern Cal and Washington still seek victory No. 1 for their new coaches.

Either California or USC will do it barring a tie, since they meet at Berkeley in the 45th renewal of their series. The Cal Bears, who have not beaten USC since 1950, rate perhaps as even-slight favorites. Never before have both Cal and USC been winless at their meeting.

Hosts Indians
Washington hosts the Stanford Indians, who went down in the final 44 seconds against Washington State last week.

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Flu Cuts Down Collegians But Many Top Tilts On Tap

The flu germ has cut a heavy swath through the collegiate football schedule for the third straight week. Still, there will be the usual jockeying for position in the upper echelon.

Michigan State, reigning king, entertains winless Purdue, and Oklahoma, the shaky but plotting former monarch, plays Kansas tomorrow.

Numerous games have been canceled and many teams weakened by the flu bug. But all the prestige games will be played. In several instances teams which would have been idle because of their opponents' physical condition have agreed to play each other.

There are loads of other top games around the country. If Washington State can get by Oregon, the Cougars are almost certain to be elected the Pacific Coast Conference representative for the Rose Bowl.

The Cougars already have licked California and Stanford, so

if they get by Oregon, they will have no one else to beat among the eligibles.

Army and Pitt are in the thick of the fight for the Eastern championship—mythical though it is.

Pitt lost its opener to Oklahoma, but has won three in a row since. Army is hoping to rebound from its defeat by Notre Dame last week.

In the South, possibly the biggest game is the Auburn-Georgia Tech affair. Undeclared Auburn has its eyes on the Southeastern Conference championship.

In the Big Ten, two of the pretenders to Michigan State's throne, Minnesota and Wisconsin, play important games. The Gophers go against Illinois while the Badgers meet defending champion Iowa.

The big one in the Southwest Conference in Texas A&M, No. 3 team in the country, against Texas Christian, Arkansas, which might give Texas A&M a run for the league crown, meets Texas.

No Excuses Taken In Blue Mt. Loop

PENDLETON (AP)—A cancelled game because of the flu means a defeat by forfeit for the team that asks it in Blue Mountain League and District 7 high school football.

This decision was reached Thursday at a meeting called because Baker and The Dalles had to call off games and there are no open weekends to reschedule them before the state playoffs start.
