Circuit Court

Complaints

Russell H. Cary, administrator for the estate of Opal Mae Weis, vs. Tracy Osborne. Plaintiff charges that the defendant allegedly caused the death of Opal Mae Weis in an auto accident that occurred at 10:30 p.m., April 11, 1957 while the two were traveling north on Highway 99 between Canyonville and Myrtle Creek in the defendant's vehicle. Plaintiff further charges that the defendant was traveling at a high rate of speed at the time of the accident while allegedly under the influence of intoxicating beverages, and that the defendant's vehicle left the road, rolled over and landed several feet from the highway. Plaintiff asks for a judgment of \$19,861.92 against the defendant for the surviving minor child of Opal Mae Weis.

Richard Loyd Nelson vs. State Industrial Accident Commission. Plaintiff charges that on April 13, 1956, while he was employed by the P & R Lumber Co. as a sawmill worker, he stepped on an area of defective flooring which caused him to fall and allegedly injured his back and neck. Plaintiff was granted a 50 per cent loss of function of one arm, but he charges his condition has grown worse and now asks for permanent partial disability of 100 per cent loss of function of one arm.

Decree

Federal National Mortgage Assn. vs. Maurice R. Thompson and all other parties claiming any title to real property involved. Decreed that defendant and all other persons and parties unknown claiming any right or title to the real property involved in the suit are forever foreclosed from asserting any right or title to the said real property.

Top Russian Soldier Sent To Turkish Border

LONDON (AP)—The Soviet Union is sending one of its top soldiers, Marshal Konstantin Rokossovsky, to command its forces on the Turkish border.

Diplomatic observers in London said the transfer of Rokossovsky, former Soviet consul of Poland, was another Russian propaganda move to keep Middle East tensions alive and bolster Syria in its cold war with Western-allied Turkey.

Syria yesterday rejected mediation of the current Middle Eastern crisis by Saudi Arabian King Saud spurring U.S. delegates to the United Nations to press for a broad inquiry into causes of the Syrian-Turkish tension.

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Upholsterers Approve New Wage Contract

PORTLAND (AP)—A two-year contract with wage increases totaling 17½ cents hourly was approved by upholsterers at Tacoma, Seattle and Portland this week, a union spokesman said here.

The agreement provides 10 cents hourly, retroactive to Sept. 1, another 4 cents next Sept. 1, and 3½ cents on March 1, 1959, said Al Beecher, business agent of local 65 of the Northwest Federation of Upholsterers and Bedding Workers.

He said the agreement, which covers 620 workers, was approved by a 280-127 vote, adding that the turnout was light because of sickness.
