

The Revelers Please Audience At Concert Association Opener

Opening the Roseburg Community Concert Assn.'s winter season the Revelers Quartet was greeted enthusiastically by a big turnout Sunday afternoon at the Central Junior High auditorium.

The four singers, Feodore Tedick and Thomas Edwards, tenors; Laurence Bogue, baritone, and Edward Ansara, basso, displayed pleasing personalities, along with excellent voices, to delight the audience. They were repeatedly called back for curtain calls and at the conclusion of their two-hour program responded generously with encores.

Not to be overlooked, pianist-accompanist William Cerny also exhibited excellent musicianship as accompanist and played two Chopin selections to the pleasure of the audience.

While most of the selections were for quartet rendition, each of the singers had ample opportunity to exhibit his singing ability in frequent individual singing rolls.

The group opened the program with "Hey, Robin" by Geoffrey Shaw, and followed with "My Love-Ly-Gilia," "No!," and "You'll Welch" compositions of "All Through the Night" and "Men of Harlech." Next came a group of Schubert's selections, "God Is My Guide," "Whither," "Serenade" and "My Abode."

After a group of American folk songs, the Revelers sang four numbers from the musical theatre, including "I'll Go Home with Bonnie Jean," from Brigadoon, "Ballad," "No Other Love," and the recent popular hit, "Dames."

After a group of well-received songs of childhood, the singers concluded with "When I Grow Too Old to Dream," "No!," and "You'll Never Walk Alone," then responded with three humorously presented selections, "I'm An Old Cowhand," "Standing on the Corner," and "Banana Boat."

of bills to those dealing with tax relief.

Rep. Clarence Barton (D), Coquille, chairman of the House Tax Committee, called a meeting of his committee for Monday afternoon.

"We will meet," Barton said, "in more or less continuous session in an effort to get this job done. The Senate Tax Committee will meet with us so that when the tax relief bills get over to the Senate, they won't have to hold duplicate hearings."

Warning on Estimates

Holmes said he believes the job can be finished in five days, but most lawmakers think it will take at least two weeks.

The Legislative Interim Tax Committee got some disturbing news Sunday when its secretary reported that revenue estimates for the current biennium might be too high.

The reason, the committee was told, is that economic conditions are getting worse and that the income tax collections might be affected.

If this is true, then the 69 million dollar surplus that is expected next June may be far less than that amount.

Warren Gill the GOP leader in the evenly-divided Senate, said Republicans also want "to make the change in the rate schedule so that it will have a measure of permanence."

Jobless Poses Problem

Gill said the Democrats "just want to pacify the taxpayer ahead of the 1958 election and then have the high rate schedule still there to clobber him with a few months later."

A few Democrats feel that a large part of the surplus should be diverted to the fund which pays unemployment benefits to the jobless in the state.

There were 26,000 jobless persons in the state last month. In a comparable period of a year ago, 15,000 were unemployed.

The state estimates that 33,500 persons were looking for work Oct. 1. This is the highest jobless total for the date since 1949, and more than double Oct. 1, 1956.

At the time of that session the state had a general fund surplus of \$11,639,325, created in part by a tax increase in the Republican-controlled Legislature of 1955.

The remainder of the 69 million dollar surplus will come from income taxes which were boosted again by the last Legislature, in which Democrats controlled the House.

Deputy Larry Wright said Saturday that milder measures had failed to halt automobile noises in the vicinity of a North Roseburg drive-in restaurant. So the sheriff's office Friday started a policy of jailing violators and impounding their cars.

The youths' cars were impounded at Billy Mohr's Towing Service and the three spent a short time in jail before they were released on \$25 bail.

Saw Manufacturing Firm Changes Name

An expanding Roseburg manufacturing-concern, Nielsen Saw & Manufacturing Co., was incorporated under that name last week for \$250,000. Filing for papers were Leo J. Nielsen, company president, and Elton M. Nielsen and James G. Richmond.

The firm had previously been known as the Nielsen Saw & Supply Co. under the same ownership. Within the past year the company has expanded and changed its overall business to manufacturing of saw equipment. It recently added facilities for producing saw sharpening equipment. Since its expansion, much of the overall production has been for out-of-state customers.

Nielsen stated that the company hopes to double its present capacity with even further expansion within the next few years, but he said that the firm still is serving as a supply house primarily for local buyers.

Minton was born at Paisley, Jan. 10, 1913, and attended Oregon State College where he was graduated from the school of forestry in 1936. He married Martha McHenry at Camas, Wash., May 6, 1936. He came to Medford in 1944 from Eastern Oregon, and in 1948 he moved to Myrtle Creek where he was one of the owners of the Pacific Lumber Distributors at Riddle. He came to Roseburg in 1953 and was employed by Evans Products Co. For the past year and a half he had been a field examiner for the Oregon Unemployment Compensation Commission.
