Holloway Made Full Admiral

WASHINGTON (AP) — Vice Adm. James L. Holloway Jr., was promoted to full admiral by President Eisenhower last week and named commander-in-chief of naval forces in the Eastern Atlantic and Mediterranean.

Adm. Holloway will replace Adm. Walter F. Boone, who will take the place of Air Force Gen. Leon W. Johnson as U. S. representative to the military committee and standing group of NATO forces.

The president also named Vice Adm. Harold P. Smith to succeed Holloway in his present post as chief of the Bureau of Navy Personnel.

Smith has been chief of staff and aide to the Supreme Allied Commander, Atlantic.

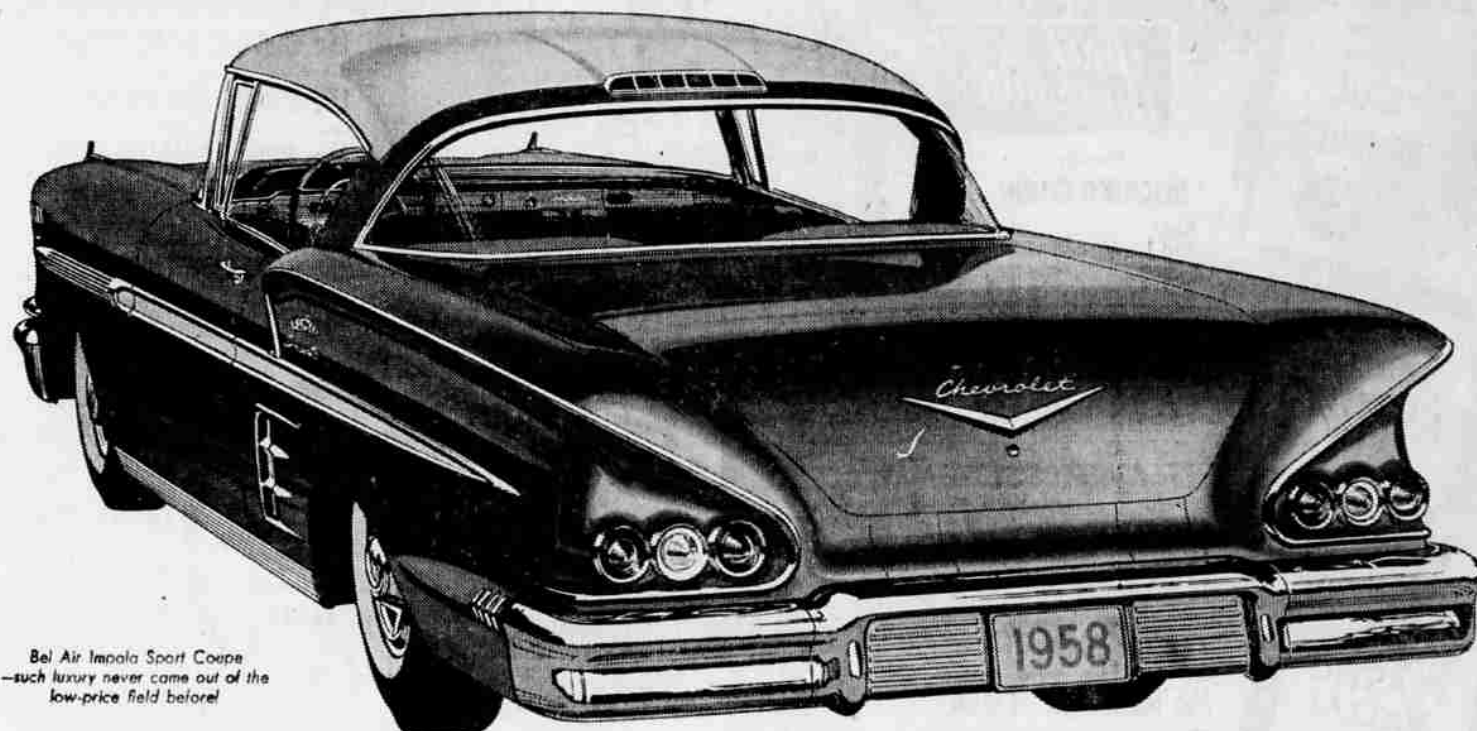
