

Morton Sobell Loses Two More High Court Appeals

MUST WED 2:34 Morton Sobell, WASHINGTON (AP) — Morton Sobell lost two more appeals to the Supreme Court Tuesday from his 30-year sentence for wartime espionage.

The high tribunal refused to act on allegations by Sobell that (A) he was kidnapped in Mexico by U.S. agents and illegally brought back to face espionage charges, and (b) his conviction was "steeped in fraud and tainted by false and perjured evidence."

Without comment the court rejected both appeals. This was the eighth time applications of one kind or another on Sobell's behalf have been turned down.

Hits Movie Censors

In other actions the Supreme Court:

1. Cracked down for a third time on movie censorship by reversing the ban imposed by Chicago's police censor board against showing of the French film "The Game of Love." The reversal, ordered without the customary hearing arguments, was in line with 1952 and 1953 Supreme Court decisions.

2. Unanimously set aside the conviction of Alvaro Alcorta, who was sentenced to die in Texas for fatally stabbing his wife. The court held that Alcorta, 28, was not given due process of law at his San Antonio trial because the prosecutor withheld information that the wife had been intimate with the state's principal witness.

67 Penguins Loaded Aboard Globemaster

MCMURDO SOUND, Antarctica (AP) — Sixty-seven penguins, destined for new lives in scientific laboratories and American zoos, were loaded aboard a U. S. Air Force Globemaster Tuesday.

The penguins—most of them headed for Portland, Ore.—are the largest collection ever to leave Antarctica and the first to go by air.

They were captured by Jack Marks, director of the Portland Zoo, and U. S. Navy personnel during the last few weeks. There are 31 emperor penguins, weighing about 60 pounds each and standing about 3 feet tall, and 36 of the smaller adels.

The Globemaster is scheduled to arrive in Christchurch, New Zealand, Wednesday morning. After stops at Nandi, Fiji in the Pacific and Honolulu, the penguins will arrive in Portland Thursday afternoon.

Six of the emperors are destined for the San Diego Zoo and 12 are going to Dr. W. J. L. Slade of Johns Hopkins University.

Others will be left in New Zealand for use by Christchurch College and still others will wind up in the Portland zoo.

4. Agreed review decisions that Federal Trade Commission authority over accident and health insurance firms is limited to states that do not have adequate laws against false advertising. FTC appealed from decisions by U.S. Circuit Courts in Cincinnati and New Orleans.

The court disposed of Sobell's appeals in a brief order which noted only that the court would not act on them.

Permitted Filing of Brief

The tribunal did permit the filing of "friend of the court" briefs urging that Sobell be granted a review. The brief was prepared by attorneys who said they acted in behalf of some 5,300 persons. A list of names included that of Dr. Harold C. Urey, atomic scientist.

Sobell was convicted in 1951 as a member of the Rosenberg atomic spy ring. Ethel and Julius Rosenberg, convicted with him, were executed in June, 1953. Sobell is now serving his eighth year in Alcatraz penitentiary.

On Oct. 28, the supreme court rejected a Sobell petition asking that the tribunal reverse itself and grant a review of his conviction. Solicitor General J. Lee Rankin opposed any affirmative action on the two appeals denied Tuesday. The brief recalled that Federal Judge Irving R. Kaufman of New York had studied Sobell's allegations and in June, 1956, found them without merit.

Cairo Press Charges King Of Jordan

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — Cairo newspapers boomed out new attacks this week against King Hussein and his Jordan regime, charging he was making undercover deals with Israel and predicting the people would trample traitors and oppressors underfoot.

King Hussein struck back at the Egyptian propaganda attacks over the weekend. He said Sunday Egyptian leaders had "sold themselves to communism and exploited Arab nationalism to divert Egyptian public opinion away from the deteriorating situation at home."

Half or more of Jordan's population is composed of Palestine Arabs, people easily stirred by any hint that their claim to their old homes in Israel might be sacrificed in a peace settlement.

Wedding Bells In Offing Again For Rita Hayworth

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Wedding bells are in the offing for Rita Hayworth and writer-producer James Hill.

Hill, 41, says he and the glamorous redhead are planning marriage, but no date has been set. The actress divorced her fourth husband, singer Dick Haymes, two years ago in Reno.

The marriage will be the first for Hill.

Miss Hayworth's other husbands were oilman Edward C. Judson, Orson Welles and Aly Khan.

Controversial Minister Passes At Wichita Home

WICHITA, Kan. (AP) — Dr. Gerald B. Winrod, 57, militant and often-times controversial minister and religious publisher, died at his Wichita home Monday night.

He was a member of the Baptist Church. Best known of his religious publications was "The Defenders," although he was a prolific writer of pamphlets on religious and historical subjects.

Campaigning bitterly against the New Deal, Winrod staged an unsuccessful bid for the Republican nomination for U. S. senator from Kansas in 1938.

He lectured and preached in every state, and traveled extensively in foreign countries.

He is survived by his widow, Frances; a daughter and two sons.

Columnist Adjudged In Contempt For Concealing Source

NEW YORK (AP) — Marie Torre, New York Herald Tribune television columnist, was adjudged in contempt of court Tuesday for refusing to reveal the source of an article she wrote concerning singer Judy Garland.

Federal District Judge Sylvester J. Ryan sentenced Miss Torre to 10 days imprisonment but released her in her own recognition pending an appeal.

"I sympathize with you," said Ryan, "but your position is improperly taken and you have no judicial support."

Miss Torre had been called as a witness in a pretrial examination of a \$1,283,333 breach of contract and libel suit brought by Miss Garland against the Columbia Broadcasting System. Miss Torre refused a court order to reveal the name of a CBS executive who allegedly furnished information for an article she wrote last Jan. 10.

Commenting on her refusal to reveal her news source, Judge Ryan said:

"The process of the court must be obeyed, notwithstanding the high motives which have prompted you to act as you have."

The judge, who had told Miss Torre in several previous hearings in the case that he must find her in contempt, as the law now stands, asked her if she still refused to name the executive.

For Reasons already submitted in the papers," said Miss Torre, "I must respectfully decline."

Mathias Correa, Miss Torre's attorney told the court the Herald Tribune would carry the case to the U. S. Supreme Court, if necessary, to obtain a ruling on whether a reporter could be forced to reveal his source of information.

DECLARED INELIGIBLE

SALEM (AP) — Legislators are ineligible to serve as paid employees of legislative interim committees, Alys Gen. Robert Y. Thornton ruled Tuesday.

The reason, he said, is that the Constitution limits the legislators' pay to \$600 a year.
