... Metropolitan Opera star

Nadine Conner, Opera Star, Will Sing Here Wednesday

Metropolitan Opera soprano Nadine Conner, a favorite also on the concert stage and with radio and television audiences, will sing in Roseburg at Central Junior High auditorium Wednesday night. Her concert, at 8:15 p.m., is sponsored by the Roseburg Community Concert Assn.

A soloist with symphony orchestras, Miss Conner will again appear during the 1957-58 season, with orchestras across the country. As guest artist with the Cincinnati Summer Opera for the past two seasons, she appeared in "Rigoletto," "La Boheme," "Traviata" and "Faust."

Last season her concert tour was one of the longest she has ever made. She was guest artist of the Greater Opera Guild of Miami, the Northwest Grand Opera and the Cosmopolitan Opera. In addition to her regular leading roles at the Metropolitan Opera, she sang two new major roles: Marguerite in "Faust" and Antonia in "Tales of Hoffman."

Voice of Firestone

A frequent performer on "The Voice of Firestone," one of Miss Conner's most successful TV appearances was in General Electric's telecast of Stephen Vincent Benet's "A Child Is Born." She gave a poignant performance as the innkeeper's wife, acting as well as singing.

Even her vacations turned out to be more than simple rest. A couple of years ago when she went with her husband, Dr. Laurence Heacock, and their two adopted children on a trip around the world, the State Department persuaded Miss Conner to give some concert along the way, notably in Athens with the National Symphony of Greece, and in Honolulu.

The regard which the world's leading opera house holds for the leading soprano star was indicated when she was chosen to sing the leading feminine role in the Metropolitan Opera's much heralded revival of Debussy's "Pelléas et Melisande" in the 1953-54 season. The previous season she had been chosen to sing Mimi in the new English-language production of "La Boheme," which had its world-premiere at a broadcast matinee from the Metropolitan stage, commanding the attention of the largest opera audience in the world.
