

Izaak Walton Speaker To Report On Conservation By Utilization

Dr. J. Alfred Hall, director of the U.S. Forest Service Forest Products Laboratory, Madison, Wis., will speak on "opportunities in conservation through utilization" at the Oregon division, Izaak Walton League of America, 35th annual convention in Eugene, Nov. 30.

"Dr. Hall's address should be of wide interest to all Oregonians," Dr. A. J. Krefl, Portland physician and Walton state president, said. "He is one of the foremost authorities on wood research, a field which has special appeal in Oregon, the nation's No. 1 lumber and plywood manufacturing state and a ranking producer of pulp, paper and hardboard."

The noted scientist has served as head of the Forest Products Laboratory, the world's largest wood research center, the past six years. Previously he was director of the Pacific Northwest Forest and Range Experiment station in Portland from 1945-51.

Runs Concurrently

The Walton League's Young Outdoor Oregonian conference will run concurrently with the division meeting and its theme will be "Water"—with the McKenzie River as an object lesson, according to L. C.

Binford, Portland, director of the youth conference. A panel discussion on "Pollution, Our Continuing Target," will be held on Friday afternoon, Nov. 29, with Dr. David Charlton, Portland sanitary bacteriologist, serving as moderator. Representatives from the Corps of Engineers, sand and gravel, food processing and pulp and paper industries and the Game Commission will speak on the subject.

Other Friday discussions scheduled include Glenn Jackson, Medford, vice-resident and general manager of the California-Oregon Power Company and member of the Oregon Development Commission, speaking on "Problems in

Four Teenagers Get 15 Years For Car Thefts

SPOKANE — Four teenagers, three of whom had been cited into juvenile court 12 times before, were sentenced as adults Tuesday to not more than 15 years in prison for car theft.

One of the boys, George Clairmont, 17, collapsed in tears as Superior Judge Hugh H. Evans rejected pleas for probation and passed sentence.

"How many times have you been pleaded with, urged to quit, admonished as to what your conduct would lead to?" the judge asked. "Despite your promises that you would never do it again, that you were sorry, you continued to be defiant."

Clairmont and the others, Ronald DeBoer, 17; Duane Ostlund, 16 and Dean W. McGuire, 17, had been remanded from juvenile court to face charges of stealing a car and wrecking it.

Officers said they also admitted being involved in 11 car thefts and eight burglaries. Judge Evans said he would recommend a six-month term in the State Reformatory for all four youths.

Chemical Analyzer Of Instantaneous Speed Developed

DETROIT — A new electronic instrument so fast it can complete a chemical analysis in one ten-thousandth of a second was described Tuesday by Bendix Aviation Corp.

The device, called a "time-of-flight mass spectrometer," can analyze an almost instantaneous sequence of chemical reactions such as takes place in explosion of rocket fuels. Company officials said it will have numerous applications in the field of missiles, rocketry, processing and control of petroleum, chemicals and medicine.

The instrument operates on the principle of instantly identifying vaporized gases, liquids and solids (including metals) by revealing their molecular masses. "Use of radar techniques to pulse the signal up to 10,000 times a second is the key to the new spectrometer's speed," said Dr. Albert C. Hall, general manager of the Bendix Research Laboratories division.

Runaway Truck Driver Placed On Probation

YREKA, Calif. — The driver of the runaway truck that killed two men in Dunsuir last July was placed on probation Tuesday for three years.

The driver, Buel Kinchloe, was told to surrender his chauffeur's license and instructed not to drive a truck during the period of probation. He may drive an automobile.

Judge James M. Allen of superior court said he did not order a jail term because "I think his health is such that he might die in jail."

Kinchloe collapsed twice at the start of his trial Oct. 29 and was in a hospital for a long period. After the charge was reduced from felony manslaughter to a misdemeanor status he pleaded guilty.

The Tucson, Ariz., man's big truck-trailer, carrying 75,000 pounds of plywood from Albany, Ore., to Tucson, got out of control on a long downgrade into Dunsuir. It sideswiped 12 cars in town, knocked the fronts off four buildings, and overturned.

Teamster Fund To Help Hoffa

ST. LOUIS — Top officials of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters said Wednesday officers of the union plan to raise a legal defense fund.

James R. Hoffa of Detroit, president-elect of the union, and Teamster Vice President Harold J. Gibbons of St. Louis both denied a Chicago Tribune report the fund may reach two million dollars.

Hoffa predicted \$75,000 to \$100,000 would be raised. Gibbons said "if we could get \$30,000 I would be very happy."

Hoffa said in Detroit none of the money would be used for his defense in pending trials. The union expects a wave of litigation involving other officials and business agents, Hoffa said.

Gibbons said full-time paid officers of the union would contribute to the fund and those participating would give a \$1,000 promissory note to be paid off at the rate of \$10 a week.

Nehru Would Lift India From 'Cow Dung Age'

NEW DELHI — Prime Minister Nehru told Parliament today India must forge ahead with its 15-billion-dollar, second five-year plan to get out of the "Cow dung age."

Nehru said more than 75 per cent of India's power is now produced by burning cow dung. His government is planning to start more atomic research centers "so as not to be left behind in this Sputnik age," he said.

"The launching of the second Soviet earth satellite 'has affected our thinking on planning,'" Nehru said. "We have to look ahead beyond the second plan period and think in terms of the third and fourth five-year plans, yoking atomic power for peaceful purposes."

Lincoln Trial Medal Awarded A. B. Chandler

FRANKFORT, Ky. — Gov. A. B. Chandler has joined President Eisenhower as one of the only two persons to receive the honorary Lincoln Trail medal of the Kentucky Boy Scouts.

Chandler was honored Sunday as he received membership in the Order of The Arrow, Boy Scouts Indian tribe.

Scouts receiving the medal must hike 32 1/2 miles from Elizabethtown to the Lincoln Memorial. More than 10,000 scouts from throughout the country have walked the trail.
