

**U. S. Lets Contract For Atom-Powered Ship**

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States will launch a nuclear-powered merchant ship in 1959. A \$20,908,714 contract for construction of the vessel was awarded yesterday to the New York Shipbuilding Corp. of Camden, N. J. A joint announcement by the Maritime Administration and the Atomic Energy Commission said the atomic propulsion system would be supplied by Babcock & Wilcox Co. under a separate contract with AEC for another nine million dollars. The ship, to be named the NS (for nuclear ship) Savannah, is to be 587 feet long, have a beam of 78 feet, a service speed of 20 knots and a deadweight tonnage of 10,190 tons, the announcement said.

**Bonneville, BPA Plan Exchange**

**Neuberger Sees Higher Respects For Scientists**

PORTLAND (AP)—A new respect and higher status for men and women of intellectual attainment has come from Russia's threat to American supremacy in science. Sen. Neuberger (D-Ore.) told a convocation at Portland State College Tuesday. He said there had been a time, now ended, in which "poets, scientists, researchers and professors were subject to unfortunate and unfair ridicule."

He suggested, as he has before, that the educational provisions of the GI Bill of Rights be revived to give this country a reservoir of skilled manpower. The senator Monday night spoke at Silverton and concerned himself with farm topics. He said that the federal price support program should be broadened. He said it was absurd for the government to subsidize tobacco and leave unsupported the prices on eggs, fruits and vegetables.
