One of the funniest, if not one of the best, colored basketball teams of the past several years, the Harlem Clowns, will take on the House of David basketball team Saturday, Dec. 14, in the Roseburg High School gym starting at 8 p.m.

The six-man Harlem team is advertised as the funniest basketball team in the United States. They are on the court, not only to win, but to give fans a fancy exhibition of razzle-dazzle ball handling, intricate routines, both planned and improvised comedy and other shenanigans.

The team, owned and managed by Runt Pullins, rolled up an impressive record of 148 wins and two losses last season against some of the finest clubs in the nation. Auburn, Arizona State Nab National Statistics Honors

Auburn and Arizona State, the only unbeaten and untied major college football teams this season, already virtually have wrapped up two of the season's statistical championships although each has one more game to play.

Auburn has a defensive record that could be beaten only by an almost impossible combination of events. Arizona State's total offense and scoring rate is so high there's almost no chance of anyone catching the Sun Devils.

Utah and Georgia Tech also come up to their final games with their leads in forward passing of offense and in defense against passing apparently secure. That leaves just one team statistical title to be decided this week—the three-way race among Army, Mississippi and Colorado for the top place in rushing offense.

Here's how they stand in this week's NCAA Service Bureau statistics:

Sun Devils

Arizona State has a total offense average of 449.2 yards a game and has scored at the rate of 38.9 points a game with a total of 350 in nine games. Army would have to score 65 points against Navy to match that scoring average, even if the Sun Devils should be held scoreless by Arizona. Army (405.8 yards a game)

Colorado Season Ended

In rushing, it's Army with 323.3 yards a game; Mississippi with 322.8 and Colorado with 322.4. The first two play Navy and Mississippi State, respectively, while Colorado's season is over.

Utah has gained an average of 209 yards a game via the air in nine contests this year. The Utes have completed 125 of 202 attempted passes for 1,831 yards and a 61 percent completion percentage.

Washington State is third with a 180.8 per game average for 10 games. The Cougars have completed 136 of 253 attempted passes for 1,808 yards and a .538 completion percentage.

Spartan Coach Picks MSU At Nation's Top Grid Team

EAST LANSING, Mich. —

Which team does Coach Duffy Daugherty of Michigan State think should be on top of the football polls?

Auburn? Nope. Ohio State? Try again. Michigan State? Stop right there.

"Maybe I'm prejudiced," admitted Daugherty, "but I still think we have the greatest team in the country."

It was like asking a beaming mother which was the prettiest baby in the pretty baby contest.

"We were always at our best against the big ones. Look at Michigan (25-6), Notre Dame (34-6) and Minnesota (42-13). Those were the teams that were advertised in advance as the toughest on our schedule."

"Sure we lost one. (to Purdue 26-13) but Purdue was great that day. But so did Ohio State, to Texas Christian. And look at the TCU record from there on in," Daugherty said.

Arizona State Plugged As Best Team In West

LOS ANGELES —

A Los Angeles sports editor said Friday it's "too bad we can't draft Arizona State to be our Rose Bowl representative."

Paul Zimmerman told readers of his column in the Times: "Whether you like it or not, the evidence points strongly to the fact that the best college football team in the West this fall is Arizona State at Tempe."

"This suspicion is not based on the statements of Coach Moose Jyres, whose team was pulverized to the point that the College of Pacific coach called it (Arizona State) the best team since the 1933 eleven."

(Actually Oklahoma was the 1935 national champion. The Sooners were ranked first in the final Associated Press poll of the season ahead of Michigan State and Maryland. UCLA was ranked fourth.)

Arizona's High Scoring

"There's more to it even than the fact that the Sun Devils are unbeaten, or the additional information that their 350 points scored in nine games make them the nation's leader in this department," Zimmerman said.

"Take a look at a few comparative scores, since that's the only yardstick immediately available. Coach Dan Devine's team beat Idaho 19 to 7. Our Rose Bowl representative — Oregon — was happy to get out with a 9 to 6 win over the Vandals."

"Washington State beat Idaho by a touchdown and Oregon State, the team that was to have been the best in the Pacific Coast Conference, by far, won by three (over Idaho)."

OSC Would Be Tossup

"So Arizona State, in comparative figures, might be a tossup with the Beavers, and better than the other two."

"UCLA, defeated College of Pacific 21 to 0. The Sun Devils massacred COP 41 to 0. They also ran wild at the expense of San Jose State, winning 41 to 6. Stanford swarmed over San Jose 46 to 7, so you have to believe the Arizona boys are as good as the Indians."

"Again, take the Rose Bowl team. Oregon beat San Jose only 26 to 0."

Heifers On Loose Give Portland Police Busy Day

A dozen Portland police had something to be thankful for Thanksgiving Day: The day finally ended.

They spent most of their shift putting around after two heifers that had escaped from a railroad yard.

The ability to cope with wandering cows long ago disappeared from the force, and the patrolmen spent anxious moments edging up on the wild-eyed heifers to get close enough to toss a lariat.

But their lariat-tossing is even worse than their edging-up, and they succeeded only in sending the heifers racing on through more back yards.

The edging-up became even more ragged after one of the heifers turned on two of the patrolmen. The panting patrolmen later reported that they did not know how they did it, but they outran

between two small buildings later and captured.

The heifers, along with 32 others, were being shipped from a Texas cattle ranch to the Max Jackson Ranch at Prosser, Wash. The two got loose when the cows were being transferred from the train to trucks.
