

Death Of Satellite Rocket Claimed By U. S. Scientists

WASHINGTON — U. S. and British scientists say there is every indication Russia's satellite rocket — which put Sputnik I into orbit Oct. 4 — plunged to its death Saturday night.

But where it fell, and when, remained a mystery in the face of widely scattered claims to seeing it fall.

Sputnik I still is circling the earth, as is the Soviet dog-carrying satellite Sputnik II, which was launched Nov. 3.

U. S. scientists, meanwhile, continued their preparations for firing the first American satellite into space this week, possibly Wednesday.

Objects Reported
There were several reports of flaming objects being sighted over the weekend. One of these, from Fairbanks, Alaska, coincided with the predicted passage of the rocket over that city, and it was being investigated further.

But the other sightings apparently involved something other than the rocket. Some experts also discounted the Fairbanks report, saying the object probably was a giant fireball, or meteor.

Russia has had nothing official to say about the rocket's fall. But a Moscow radio broadcast said the rocket had completed 894 orbits as of 10 p. m. yesterday. An earlier broadcast said the rocket would be visible today.

Dr. Fred L. Whipple, director of the Smithsonian Astrophysical Observatory at Cambridge, Mass., said the rocket's end may have come on its 879th trip around the earth.

Alaska Scientists Deny Rocket Fall

FAIRBANKS, Alaska — University of Alaska scientists Sunday discounted reports that the expended rocket of the first Russian earth satellite plunged to earth on the Ft. Greely military reservation 100 miles southeast of here Saturday.

The report came from Pfc. Robert L. Gold, public information specialist at Ft. Greely, who said a glowing object fell on the military reservation at 3:20 p. m. Saturday. Gold said it was believed the object was the Sputnik I rocket.

Scientists at the University of Alaska's Geophysical Institute said, however, that the object was a giant fireball, or meteor. A spokesman for the institute said calls from persons who sighted the object came in steadily for about three hours.

The institute said the fire ball, described as an extremely large one, was sighted at "plus or minus five minutes" of the time the Sputnik I rocket was due over Fairbanks Saturday afternoon.

Graveside Services Set For Roseburg Veteran

Drake died Friday in the Portland Veterans Hospital. He was born Aug. 22, 1899, in Pio, Iowa, and was a resident of Corey Street at the time of his death. He was a veteran of World War I.

Surviving are five sons, William W. and Richard, both of Roseburg; James C. Minden, Iowa; Robert, in the U. S. Marines, stationed at Camp Pendleton, Calif.; and Jerry also of Roseburg; his mother, Mrs. Genevieve Drake, Cedar Rapids, Iowa; a sister, Mrs. Maxine Lucas, Cedar Rapids, and two grandchildren.

The chapel of the Rose is in charge of the local arrangements.

Umpqua Man Succumbs At Home Of His Sister
Albert Azbill, a resident of Douglas County for 1½ years, died Sunday at the home of his sister Mrs. Magnus Nielsen, Umpqua. He was 48.

Born in Bakersfield, Calif., Azbill had lived there until 1956, when he moved to Umpqua. He was a World War II veteran.

Surviving, beside the sister, are one brother, Waldemar Azbill, Downey, Calif.; three nephews and one niece.

Funeral arrangements will be announced later.

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Izaak Waltons Condemn Efforts To Stop State Department Heads From Speaking

EUGENE — The Oregon Izaak Walton League, which closed its annual meeting here Saturday, approved a resolution condemning any effort by a public official to withhold professional views of state department heads.

This was an apparent criticism of Gov. Robert D. Holmes, who recently directed the Oregon Fish and Game Commissions not to make statements at public hearings until a state water policy had been established.

Re-Elected
Delegates re-elected Dr. Alfred Krefl, Portland, as state division president. His entire slate of 1957 officers also was re-elected: Homer Smith, Hood River, treasurer; Arthur K. Roberts, Portland, secretary, and Alan Kelly, Portland, vice president.

Jack Binson, Portland, was named national executive; William Niskanen, Bend, and Rollin E. Bowles, Portland, national directors; Luhr Jensen, Hood River, Col. Paul Weiland, Medford, and Leighton Whitsett, of Salem, were named vice presidents.

Other resolutions approved called for: Legislation that will provide penalties or revocation of hunting licenses for hunters and anglers convicted of willful destruction of property.

Calls For Abatement
The Oregon Sanitary Authority to bring immediate abatement proceedings against a lumber firm which the league said was polluting Hood River.

Enforcement of game laws, now handled by state police, to be placed in the hands of the state commissions.

A unit-type deer hunt system for taking antlerless deer in place of the general either-sex hunt.

The Game Commission to close one or more coast rivers to spring trout fishing.

Opposition to high dams at Nez Perce site on the Snake River, at Wenaha on the Grande Ronde River, and Lower Canyon and Crevice on the Salmon River, at least until a method of getting fish by the dams can be developed.

Indonesians Intensify Anti-Dutch Campaign
JAKARTA — The Indonesian government intensified its anti-Dutch campaign today with a 24-hour strike against Dutch companies, a virtual ban on the departure of Dutch residents and a shutdown on the operations of the KLM Airline in the island republic.

Indonesia's demand for Dutch-held West New Guinea and the Netherlands' refusal to negotiate on the subject prompted the new pressure campaign. The U. S. General Assembly last Friday declined to support an Indonesian proposal for negotiations under U. N. sponsorship.

President Sukarno, who narrowly escaped assassination Saturday night, left Jakarta with a strong escort for Bogor Palace, in the hills 20 miles away. The government pressed a search for the attackers who threw four bombs at the President as he left a public school in nearby Tajur.
