Port Of Umpqua Survey Shown In New Report

The Douglas County Planning Commission has published the results of a survey made recently at the Port of Umpqua to determine the area the port would serve if it had deep water facilities. The study, entitled "The Cole Report," was conducted by W. C. Cole on behalf of the Port of Umpqua port commission.

The survey also determined the savings in transportation costs, both potential and actual, which could be realized from a deep water port.

According to Bruce Elmgren, county planning coordinator, the survey of transportation costs covered an area of 720 square miles in Western Douglas County, from Winchester Bay to a point between Elkton and Drain.

The report indicates that with these harbor improvements, the Port of Umpqua could effectively serve Eugene and Roseburg, Elmgren said.

Copies of the report can be obtained from the Douglas County Planning Commission for a nominal fee.

Kidney Transplant Twins In Serious Condition

BOSTON (AP) — Two 14-year-old twins, each of whom received a kidney from the respective twin in kidney transplant operations, are reported in serious condition at Peter Bent Brigham Hospital.

Doctors said last night Delores Huskey of De Soto, Mo., was making a good recovery until an infection invaded her new kidney from the intestinal tract.

Her twin sister Doris donated one of her healthy kidneys Sept. 1.

Doctors also said Jimmy Foster of Pocatello, Idaho, has been in serious condition since the transplant was made from his brother Jerry Nov. 25.

Both Doris Huskey and Jerry Foster have progressed satisfactorily.

The hospital said Delores Huskey is being treated with new drugs to combat the infection.

Germans Said Split Over Whether Nuclear Weapons Should Be Used By Army

Adolf Diegel, a University of Oregon exchange student from Cologne, Germany, told Roseburg Rotary Club members Thursday that a split seems to exist among Germans on the question of whether West Germany should be allowed the use of nuclear weapons.

Diegel, who is seeking a master's degree in business education, said the German press indicates that public feeling favors the use of nuclear weapons by the NATO-organized army. This, he said, stems from public opposition to the use of Germans as "foot soldiers" in the western defense plan.

But, on the other hand, most politicians are against the nuclear arms idea because they fear it will involve Germany more quickly in any war between the East and West, said Diegel. Russia has voiced opposition to such a plan, and Diegel said German politicians feel Germany would be put in an awkward position should it be granted the use of such arms.

Diegel also said that most Germans do not value German "unification" highly enough to want to go to war for it. He said the East-West split in Germany is more a political one than a practical one, anyway, pointing out that travel between the two sectors is a simple matter.

Termining the German educational system "superior in practice" to the U.S. system, Diegel said American students are allowed too much freedom in the choice of subject matter.

Theory Best
"In theory, I think the American system is the best in the world, but in practice the German system is superior," said Diegel. "Students generally tend to be lazy, and if left to their own choice of subjects, they'll take the easy way instead of taking courses such as mathematics, or science."

He said education in Germany is compulsory up to the age of 15. Subject material is more or less prescribed in individual schools, Diegel said, and the choice parents have concerning their children's education lies mostly in choice of schools.

Diegel said the nationalistic feeling which formerly was so prominent in Germany has diminished, as it has elsewhere in Europe.

"We see ourselves now as much more a part of the European community than formerly," said Diegel.

Group To Create Better Impression About Economy

Three Douglas County people have been elected officers of a new organization formed in Eugene pledged to the purpose of "creating a grassroots organization to create favorable and correct unfavorable state-wide economic conditions."

President of the new organization is Frank I. Jinney of Lane County. Serving with him from Douglas County are: Lloyd Sconce, Roseburg, vice president; and Mrs. Grant Cross of Green and H. L. Goodmansson of Roseburg, directors.

Goodmansson explained that the group is "deeply concerned about the unemployment, decreasing business, decreasing home building, increasing taxes and general increase of government services that are causing undue hardship in our communities."

The organization will be known as the Oregon Citizens' Council. The charter officers have been empowered to draw up a constitution fashioned to carry forth aims and objectives.

The three Douglas County members of the executive group have all been outspoken about government costs in the county. Mrs. Cross and Sconce led the attack which resulted in a big scale reshuffle of duties and activities of the Douglas County Planning Commission early this year.

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Corvallis Child Drowns In Mill Pond Near Home

CORVALLIS (AP) — Karry Lee Zandofsky, 16 months old, drowned in a mill pond 100 yards from his home Thursday.

He wandered away while other members of the family were asleep.

Frank Zandofsky, the father, said he last saw the boy when he put a fresh pair of pajama pants on him at 12:30 a.m. When the parents arose at 7:30 a.m., the pants were on the floor and the child was gone.

James Griffen, the boy's grandfather, found the body several hours later.

The Zandofskys have another son and a daughter.

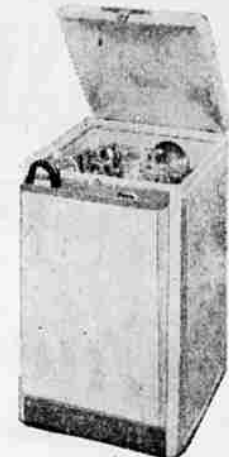

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Bate Lumber Co. Timber Buyer

The only bidder in an Umpqua National Forest timber sale at Roseburg Thursday paid \$3 over the appraised price for a tract in the Cow Creek District, 26 miles east of Glendale.

Successful bidder was Bate Lumber Co. of Merlin. Appraised price of the tract of 2,200,000 board feet was \$49,595. The company paid \$49,600.

The tract contains 1,600,000 board feet of Douglas fir appraised at \$24.10 per thousand, 500,000 feet of ponderosa and sugar pine appraised at \$21.40 and 100,000 feet of white fir and other species appraised at \$3.35. The company paid the appraised prices on all but the white fir and other species, for which it paid \$3.40.

The next sale is scheduled Jan. 2, 1958.

Duke Of Windsor Has Tea With Elizabeth

LONDON (AP) — An official announcement from Buckingham Palace that Queen Elizabeth II and the Duke of Windsor had tea together renewed speculation today that the court may be about to lift its ban on the American-born, twice-divorced duchess.

The duke usually drops in to see his niece on his fairly frequent trips to London from his home outside Paris. But this was the first time since Elizabeth became queen in 1952 that the palace had announced such a visit.

Rock Slide Kills Man Out Of Grants Pass

GRANTS PASS (AP) — Charles Mayse Warnock, 30, of Applegate, was killed Thursday by a rock slide 30 miles southeast of Grants Pass.

He and three other men were drilling into shale at the time for a road construction project along Steve's Fork of the Applegate River.

The slide started above. The others managed to jump clear but Warnock was hit by rocks and killed outright.

The four were working for the A. L. Harding Construction Co. of Stayton on a forest access road for the Bureau of Public Roads.

House Of Lords Will Admit Petticoat Peers

LONDON (AP) — One of the male animal's last citadels, the British House of Lords, last night agreed to a petticoat infiltration.

The upper house of the British Parliament unanimously approved a bill authorizing Queen Elizabeth II, on recommendation of the government, to create lifetime peers, both male and female, who would sit with the lords.

The lifetime titles will lapse on the death of the holders, a device intended to attract those who think a person should earn position, not inherit it.

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
