

Oregon Prep Cagers Start Action Tonight

The Oregon high school basketball season goes into full swing this weekend.

Most teams will play in league games or in games that do not count in district standings toward state tournament contention.

Lincoln of Portland, the defending state class A-1 champion, will play at David Douglas of Portland Saturday.

Jefferson of Portland plays host Friday to The Dalles and Washington of Portland travels to Vancouver, Wash. to meet Evergreen. Franklin of Portland moves into

the Willamette Valley for games with South Eugene Friday and Springfield Saturday.

Cleveland of Portland will go to Hillsboro, Roosevelt to Battle Ground, Wash., and Wilson of Portland to Forest Grove for Saturday action.

Central Catholic of Portland, runner-up in the 1937 state tournament, will be in a Friday night jamboree at Milwaukie High School. Others in this Metropolitan League, district 3 affair are Astoria, Hillsboro, Parkrose, David Douglas, Gresham and Beaverton. Astoria also will be host to Seaside Saturday night.

Stanford Man President Of Coast Conference

SAN FRANCISCO — Professor Rixford K. Snyder of Stanford is the new president of the Pacific Coast Conference.

He was elected Thursday at the closing session of league's winter meeting to succeed Professor Emmett B. Moore of Washington State, who has been president three years.

Professor Glenn W. Holcomb of Oregon State was elected secretary.

At Masters of Stanford was elected chairman of the conference athletic directors group and George Briggs of Washington, secretary.

Knot Hole Club Offered Tickets

The Knot Hole Club, consisting of all elementary students of Roseburg schools, will have another added treat in store for them as they had during the football season. Loren (Dutch) Simons, athletic director of the Roseburg School District, has a plan now in effect that will admit each member of the club to all of the Roseburg High School home basketball games for 75 cents. This includes 10 basketball games.

Each season ticket will be numbered and a drawing will be made during the halftime of each game with the winner being awarded a basketball, through the courtesy of the Umpqua Lions Club.

The Knot Hole section will be in the bleachers on the girls' upper deck on the right as they enter the gym. Only students with membership cards may sit in this section. Students without cards must sit in the visiting students section, unless they are accompanied by their parents.

Membership cards were handed out to the students of the grade schools during the football season and these same cards will be in effect for basketball. Providing the student does not have a season's ticket, he may purchase a ticket for 10 cents with his card if he is in the fourth through sixth grades.

Single admission for students in the seventh and eighth grades will be 25 cents per game. Grades from one through three will be admitted free if they are accompanied by their parents. If these students wish to sit in the Knot Hole section, they must buy a ticket.

While the students are in the special section they will be under the supervision of the Umpqua Lions Club. Only those buying season tickets will be eligible for the prizes at halftime.
