Holiday Driving Sanity Is Urged

Chief of Police Vernon Murdoch Jr. has again issued a plea for sanity on the highways and streets over the holiday season.

"Responsibility for success or failure of Oregon's efforts to have a safe holiday season will rest with the actions of every individual," Murdoch said. "Every resident of Roseburg should join in the attack on holiday accidents by contributing his efforts to drive and walk as he should."

He pointed out that figures pre-

pared by the Department of Motor Vehicles' Traffic Safety Division show that about 94 per cent of all accidents are directly caused by traffic law violations on the part of at least one driver or pedestrian involved.

The chief also pointed out that a nationwide study of fatal accidents last Christmas showed that 55 per cent of them involved drinking drivers. He warned that strict enforcement against such drivers can be expected in Roseburg during the Christmas-New Year holiday season.

"When you realize that accidents cost Oregon more than 50 million dollars last year," he said, "It's easy to understand why officials decided a stepped-up attack was necessary."

Dry Cleaners Organize; Honn Named President

Clarence Honn has been elected president of the newly formed United Dry Cleaners Assn. of Douglas County. Other officers are Ken Glass, vice president, and Lloyd Kegler, secretary-treasurer. All are from Roseburg.

Navy Releases Names Of Nine Killed In Crash

CORPUS CHRISTI, Tex. (AP) — The names of nine men killed when a Navy seaplane plunged to the ground in flames soon after taking off here Monday were released by the Navy Monday night.

An engine exploded and blew one of the plane's wings off. One man parachuted to safety. He was Storekeeper L. C. Sam Griffin and he was badly burned.

Lt. Cmdr. James N. Scofield, 40, pilot, Coronado, Calif.; Lt. (jg) Howard B. Dickerson, 23, co-pilot, Arlington, Va.; Lt. (jg) Roy W. Bruner Jr., 26, navigator, Silver Springs, Md.; John J. Lanna, 41, aviation machinist's mate, Chula Vista, Calif.; Paul Faircloth, 27, aviation electronics mate, Jacksonville, Fla.; Karl B. Dummer, 38, chief aviation metallsmith, Imperial Beach, Calif.; Richard K. Kiermaier, 24, aviation metallsmith, San Diego, Calif.; Daniel S. Kwas, 19, aviation electrician's mate, Detroit; and Carl P. Renn, aviation machinist's mate (home town unavailable).

The body of the ninth victim was found after darkness Monday night.

The ship was from Patrol Squadron 46 based at San Diego, Calif. It was en route to Baltimore, Md., and stopped at the Corpus Christi Naval Air Station to refuel.

It took off and started trailing smoke.



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
