

Presley Granted 60-Day Delay Of Army Induction

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Singer Elvis Presley Friday was granted a 60-day delay of his induction into the Army, enabling him to complete a moving picture for Paramount Studios. He had been scheduled for induction Jan. 20. The board acted after receiving requests for the delay from both Presley and the singer. Paramount said it stood to lose about \$500,000 if Presley didn't show up in Hollywood Jan. 13 to start work on the movie. The studio said it already had spent that much in "preparatory investments."

Lumber Price Index Takes Another Drop

PORTLAND (AP) — Another 25 cent drop in its lumber price index in the past two weeks was reported by Crow's Lumber Market News Service. The drop was the result of softness in Douglas fir and a weakness in select ponderosa pine, Crow's said. The price index was down 37.63 for the year. Standard and better green fir dimension held ground and some mills asked a dollar or so more on 2x4s and 2x6s. But demand was slow. Ponderosa pine boards were steady for common grades and 12-inch No. 3 boards were up \$1 or \$2. Plywood was steady at \$72 for quarter-inch AD grade.

Consumer Appears Likely To Be King From Now On

NEW YORK (AP) — What's ahead for the American consumer? One thing seemed certain this week as the 1957 business year sputtered to a finish. From now on the consumer would be king. Competition for his spending dollar would be razor sharp. Business would bend over backwards trying to please him.

The consumer and his state of mind had obviously become a matter of increasing concern to business leaders.

President Harlow H. Curtice of General Motors cited a decline in consumer confidence as one of the main reasons for a downturn in new car sales.

Confidence Shaken
Said he: "For various reasons, confidence seems to be somewhat shaken and an attitude of caution appears to prevail. This can have a substantial effect on the level of economic activity."

Ford vice president James O. Wright voiced a similar complaint. New car sales have been hurt, he said, by "too many pessimistic announcements" about the business outlook.

From Detroit came word that the auto industry is getting set to lure potential customers with enticements ranging from improved service to free lubrication jobs. Big volume producers are devising new schemes to persuade car owners to switch brands.

To Woo Customers
Department and specialty store executives planned to woo customers with better values, fewer frills and lower prices. Christmas business had been good (department store sales for the week ended Dec. 21 were up four per cent from a year ago) but the

holiday shopping surge had given way to a massive post-Yule let-down.

Merchants stocked with left-over merchandise slashed prices right and left. Before them loomed 1958, with rising unemployment and balky customers likely to spread a wet blanket over retail sales.

For worried retailers, the Secretary Mitchell had this advice: Even though unemployment rises in the next few months, customers will respond to fresh styles, good quality and attractive prices if you tell them about it in the proper way.

Klamath Mouse Survey Slated

WASHINGTON (AP) — A specialist in communicable diseases will go to Klamath Falls Dec. 30 to observe the outbreak of meadow mice in that area.

"Tularemia has been found to be killing rodents from two or three localized areas. It apparently is being spread in the rodent population, mainly by cannibalism at the present time. No plague has yet been found and few flea vectors were seen on the rodents," Bauer said.

Will Survey
He will survey the size and character of the rodent population, watch for other disease hazards and recommend control measures to augment those already being used.

Two weeks ago Neuberger asked the Public Health Service to send specialists to the area.

Bauer said 200 live and dead rodents have been collected by Fred Prince, chief of the San Francisco station, and Dr. Leo Kartman, a member of this staff.
