Harlem Globetrotters Set Appearance Here Jan. 14

The team that has won more athletic contests than any other in history and has played cage games on everything from Berlin's Olympic Stadium to a court of table tops is coming to Roseburg on Tuesday, Jan. 14.

The Harlem Globetrotters, will play the equally strong Washington Generals on the Roseburg High School court starting at 8:15 p.m. Noted for their many zany and patented basketball clowning, plus a bill of variety acts, the Globetrotters, in their last year of action, will be out to give the Roseburg area fans one of the best basketball games seen for several years in this area.

In the 31 years that owner Abe Saperstein has had the world famous team, they have played in over 50 countries and before millions of people from one corner of the country to the other.

During last season's play they ran up a total of 427 wins against only four losses, all four of them at the hands of the college all-stars, who also lost 15 times. The most losses ever handed the Globetrotters in one season was back in 1941 where they dropped 18 games while winning 135, or an 88.2 average. In the 30 complete years of playing they have rolled up a total of 5,822 wins against only 207 losses for .962.

The Trotters will come to Roseburg with a crew of eight of the finest basketball players in the history of the team, headed by 6-2 Bob (Showboat) Hall and 6-8 J. C. Gibson.

West Virginia and Mississippi State each have 10-0 records. State gets its chance to extend its streak tonight against Alabama in a Southeastern Conference game.

State's biggest threat is Jack Kubiszyn, third in the league scoring race. He's only 5-10 but has been hitting at a 22.8-point-per-game pace.

State and West Virginia are looking around for worries, they only need consider some of the following:

Big Eight Question

1. No one will hazard a guess at what will happen in the Big Eight, which begins operations tomorrow night. Kansas, the defending champion and NCAA runner-up last season, was beat by Oklahoma State with Wilt (The Stilt) Chamberlain. Oklahoma probably will tell the Chamberlain story. He's supposed to be ready.

2. Maryland, big wheel in the Atlantic Coast Conference since North Carolina was beaten, has lost two games in the past week. Clemson dumped them 73-66 Saturday night. The Terps play North Carolina Saturday.

3. The Southwest Conference is in a tizzy. Texas Tech, the brand new league member, whipped preseason favorite Rice Saturday. Tonight Tech gets a shot at the current favorite, Texas Christian.

4. Michigan State, one of the monsters of the Big Ten which ran up seven victories in a row at the start of the season, was beaten 70-56 by Ohio State, a team that was clubbed by seven straight West Virginia has two games this week. They meet Villanova Wednesday and George Washington Saturday.

The victory was paced by a 27-point performance by Truman Williams, who put OTI into the lead to stay early in the second half with a field goal that broke 31-1 tie.

Johnny Winters of Portland State, however, topped the scoring with 33 points.

At La Grande Saturday, Bill Hollingsworth pushed in 29 points as Southern Oregon defeated Eastern Oregon 69-47 for the second straight night.
