Year's Grid Deaths Down—Total 16

LOS ANGELES — The American Football Coaches Assn. reports that the number of deaths caused by football in 1957 was below that of the average of the last 26 years.

But the association says more could be done to cut the fatality rate. Green deaths were reported in the United States last year. Thirteen of the victims were high school students, two were sandlot players and the other was on a semi-pro team.

Five other deaths were attributed indirectly to the sport. The report, released by Dr. Floyd R. Eastwood of Los Angeles State College, chairman of an association study committee, said football deaths have averaged 17.38 during the 26 years records have been kept. In 1956 there were 17.

The report said the number of deaths caused by blows to the head has gone up 4.5 per cent since 1947 and commented:

"It is evident that helmet construction has not kept pace with the speed of the game in 1957."

Precautions Told

"Continuing research is necessary."

The association said the specific need is for a headgear that will stand powerful blows from knees and thighs.

The group also recommended: Warm-up periods of from 5 to 10 minutes before any bodily contact.

A minimum of six weeks' practice before first game of the season.

At least six days of work on fundamentals before squad scrimmages.

Spring practice for players not participating in regular spring sports.

More complete medical examination of potential players.

More emphasis on exercises that develop shoulder and neck muscles.

An arrangement under which a doctor would be on the bench for all games, and immediately available during practice.

The report said that fatal injuries are most likely to be suffered during the first five minutes a player is in action.

George Kell Retires

SWIFTON, Ark. — George Kell looked down retirement road today and found the scenery pleasing.

"It's hard to retire," the 35-year-old veteran of 15 American League campaigns said, "but it's a lot easier than waiting around until someone tells you you're through. This is the time for me, and I know it."

The husky infielder did not seem to regret his decision ending a brilliant major league career which started in 1943 with the Philadelphia Athletics. Kell, one of only 99 major leaguers to top the 2,000-hit mark, quits with a lifetime average of .306.

LOS ANGELES — The Los Angeles Dodgers have signed first baseman Norm Larker to who hit .323 for St. Paul of the American Assn. last season.

With Larker in first base position, the Dodgers are counting on Larker as a pinch hitter.

Larker is the 13th player to sign a 1958 Dodger contract.

Bowling Alley Plan On Coast

The fourth construction of a new bowling alley in Douglas County is scheduled to start within the next two weeks in Reedsport, according to Lee Kellison, sponsor, owner of the site and main sponsor of the \$100,000 project.

The building is expected to run about \$46,000 and alleys, service facilities and other recreation projects another \$72,000.

Other new alleys put into operation or under construction during the past year have been a 16-alley Roseburg plant, 10-alley Tri-City plant and the six-alley Drain building. The Reedsport plant will have 12 modern alleys, with automatic pinsetters.

In addition to the 12 alleys in the building there will be a large seating area for spectators, a cafe and snack bar and plenty of parking space on at least two sides of the new building.

No manager of the alleys has been selected as yet, but with alley completion due for early May, one will be selected in the near future.

The snack bar will be under local management as will be the alleys.

Frank White, Gardiner, has been selected as builder of the project, with Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merfield of Corvallis, the engineering architects.

The new alleys, along with the Highland Swimming Pool is expected to be one of the main tourist attractions in the area outside of the salmon fishing. Team play is expected to start in early fall.

Thirty-Seven Games Set By State Prens

Oregon high school basketball squads have some 17 games on tap Tuesday night but few of them count in district competition.

Only two leagues, Portland and Tualatin-Yamhill Valley, have scheduled coming games.

In TTYV action, Forest Grove will open league play against McMinnville. Other district contests pit Tigard against Lake Oswego, Newberg against Tillamook and St. Helens against Oregon City.

In the Portland league, it will be Cleveland vs. Washington, Grant vs. Madison, Roosevelt vs. Franklin, Jefferson vs. Benson and Lincoln vs. Wilson.

Beaverton of the Metropolitan League goes to South Salem for a game with the Valley League Saxons. The Valley League also will be host to two strong squads from the Midwestern League — Albany vs. powerful South Eugene and Cottage Grove vs. Corvallis.

Three other Valley League teams have scheduled games with A-2 opponents. These are Lebanon vs. Silverton, North Salem vs. Dallas and Sweet Home vs. Central of Monmouth-Independence.

In the A-2 division, league play has been scheduled by the North Coast division of District 1 and the Yawama and Emerald leagues.
