

Mail Receipts Here Decline During '57

Clyde Carstens, Roseburg postmaster, said Monday that for the first time in some 15 years postal receipts in Roseburg showed a decline from those of the previous year.

Carstens said receipts for 1957 were down about 3 1/2 per cent from those of 1956. He set last year's figure at \$28,139, a drop of \$8,345 from the 1956 figure.

Receipts for each quarter of 1957 totaled less than those of the preceding quarter, said Carstens. He attributed the decline to the general economic slump experienced in southwest Oregon as a result of the lumber market dip.

He said a spot count taken of the number of families filling out change-of-address slips during the month of February resulted in a total of 289. Carstens pointed out, however, that a number of the changes were merely from one Roseburg address to another.

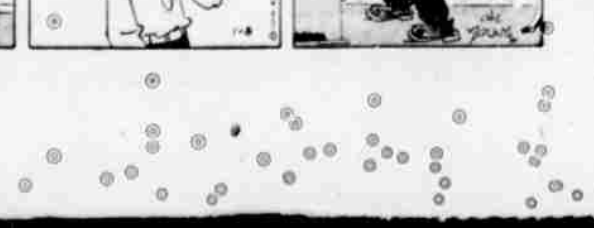

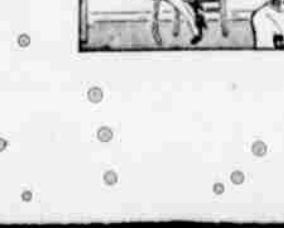

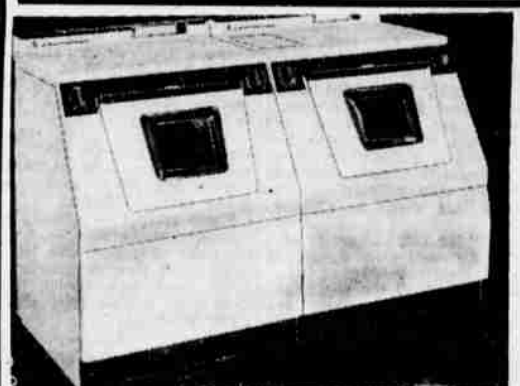
