Grim And Bloody Evidence Entered In Elaine's Trial

REDWOOD CITY, Calif. — Grim and bloody evidence was introduced Wednesday as Suzanne Elaine Soule's trial on a murder charge got underway.

Gruesome reminders of the death of Catherine (Kit) Elvins, 19-year-old daughter of a Seattle physician, were identified by Burlingame police officers Rudy Ruhl and William P. Brigham, first policemen on the scene after the July 24 slaying.

Miss Soule, 20, a former typist from Freeport, N.Y., watched the jury of seven men and five women nervously as each item was presented.

Miss Soule is charged with killing her pretty roommate and the prosecution has charged that "it was a premeditated crime for money."

Introduced were a blood-stained electric iron which police say was used to strike the Seattle girl's skull 26 times and a 14-inch kitchen knife with an 8-inch blade which police say was used to inflict wounds in the victim's chest.

Tigard Flyer Lands Plane On New Freeway

PORTLAND — George Shea, Tigard, was flying his light plane at 2,500 feet over the West Hills here Wednesday when the engine failed.

He managed to glide it eastward three miles past the downtown business district and land it on a four-lane freeway which has not yet been opened to traffic.

Shea was unhurt. The only damage was to the plane's tail, which hit a freeway dividing rail.

Later, after removal of its wings, the plane was towed back to the Beaverton Airport, where Shea had taken off earlier in the day.



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
