WASHINGTON — Loss to foreign fishermen on the high seas of salmon spawned in United States and Alaska rivers prompted Sen. Dworshak to call Wednesday for an international agreement on salmon.

Sen. Dworshak said this country is building hatcheries and expensive ladders to take the fish over dams during their migrations.

These efforts are being undone at sea by foreign floating canneries that catch fish on ocean-year-around basis," he said.

The senator said an ocean-wide agreement between all nations involved was needed. "As it is, as far as salmon are concerned, we are suckers."

Inadequate Bookkeeping System Charged

SPOKANE — Claiming the Atomic Energy Commission has an inadequate bookkeeping system, a Richland resident has refused to pay his \$8.75 garbage bill. Now the United States may go to court to collect the money.

Deputy U.S. Atty. Robert L. Fraser said Wednesday he had received a request from the Atomic Energy Commission at Hanford to force E.T. Merrill to pay his garbage bill.

Merrill refused to pay the bill on the grounds the government agency didn't have a proper bookkeeping system, the AEC said.

The garbage collection was stopped when Merrill wouldn't pay his bill but the AEC said it had no way of stopping sewage service and the suit was requested.

Richland was built by the government to house Hanford Atomic Plant workers. The sewage system is government-owned and a fee is charged for its use and collection of garbage. The AEC recently sold a number of homes to private individuals, including Merrill.

Fraser said his office was planning to file a suit after reviewing the case.
