SAN JOSE, Calif. — Capt. Jesse L. Kenworthy, 66-year-old retired Navy veteran, was in Agnews State Hospital here today, a willing inmate under the supervision of his psychiatrist friend, Dr. Walter Rapaport.  
 Thus ended an excursion by the veteran of the crash of the dirigible Macon and the sinking of the

battleship Oklahoma at Pearl Harbor. It began last Saturday when he tipped a San Francisco cab driver with a \$5,000 check.  
 Kenworthy, of Parkesburg, Pa., was committed to the institution by Superior Judge Milton D. Sapiro in San Francisco after the captain dropped his threat to fight commitment.

## Car Vandals Are Identified As Top College Students

GLENDALE, Calif. — A wave of car vandalism hit this Los Angeles suburb starting about three months ago.  
 Someone was going around wrecking parked automobiles — kicking in windshields and windows, stomping on hoods and roofs and smashing rear decks.  
 Detectives were puzzled by one aspect:  
 More than half the damaged cars were of one make (Studebaker).  
 The vandalism increased until it reached its peak during the Christmas holidays. By then, however, Det. Sgt. John J. Broom was on the trail of the culprits.  
 When he made his arrests last week of 14 youths, all 18 and 19 years old, the city was shocked.  
 College Students  
 Eight of the youths were students at Glendale College, four were on the first team of the basketball squad. All were from good families and one was a heir to a cake mix fortune.  
 The basketball players and another boy pleaded guilty to malicious mischief this week and were given stiff 150-day sentences in Glendale city jail. The others will appear in court today.  
 Why did they do it? No one had the answer, although authorities and parents came up with several ideas.

The youths themselves didn't know. Sgt. Broom said one of the basketball players told him that one night, when their team lost a game by only one point, they went out and damaged two cars.  
**Still Puzzle**  
 Why did they pick on one particular make?  
 No one knew. One boy remembered, however, that they were riding around town one day and were nearly hit by a certain make car. They made it a point to wreck others of the same make, Broom said.  
 Only one of the boys, King Archer, 19, was married. Archer, a good student at the junior college, had hoped to graduate in June. His wife expects a baby in March.  
 Commented his mother, Mrs. Charles W. Archer:  
 "The kids are not to blame — it's the times . . . the lousy dollar."
