Nassau Strike Costly Blow To Tourist Trade
NASSAU, Bahamas — Crown officials say the Nassau general strike—which showed no signs today of a letup—is costing the British Colony's tourist industry at least \$12,000 daily.
Nassau's tourist industry—the key to its prosperity—has come to a stop, a government statement said.
A week ago hotel and utility workers walked off jobs in sympathy with taxi drivers who struck in a dispute with tour companies over who should carry passengers between hotels and the airport. All of the luxury hotels are closed.
"Even if the strike is ended promptly, the tourist business in Nassau will be a long time getting started again."

Oregon Delegation Hears Rundown On Water Situation

WASHINGTON — The six members of Oregon's congressional delegation have heard a rundown on the state's water resources situation.
L. C. Binford, chairman of the Oregon Water Resources Board, spent more than an hour with the lawmakers explaining the plans and purposes of his agency.
Binford has been here meeting with spokesmen for the Interior Department and the Federal Power Commission to get procedures for obtaining cancellation of federal land reservations made for power site purposes.
Approval of both agencies is needed for such action. He said

the state wants it on various locations, particularly the upper McKenzie River, where there are plans for development of the scenic region's recreational aspects.
Binford said that in this connection he has asked Sen. Neuberger and Rep. Porter, Oregon Democrats, to introduce legislation to protect the McKenzie upper reaches if the city of Eugene builds the proposed Carmichael project.
He said he also renewed in talks with FPC officials the Oregon request that a decision be held up on the proposed licensing of the Mountain Sheep-Pleasant

Valley project until the state finishes a study of the middle Snake River.
He added that the state expects to make recommendations for mid-Snake development by the end of January.
