Former School Teacher Venezuela's New Chief

At dawn last Thursday morning a new voice was heard from the Venezuelan government's Radio Nacional.

"My name is Fabricio Ojeda," said the voice. "I am the president of the Patriotic Junta."

For the first time the people of Venezuela learned the identity of the man who led civilian forces in the revolution that toppled the dictatorship of President Marcos Perez Jimenez.

The name meant nothing to almost all who heard it. Perhaps a few recalled that a man by that name was a reporter for the newspaper El Nacional.

Ojeda, 31-year-old reporter and former grade school teacher, was revealed after the downfall of Perez Jimenez to be the leader of an underground organization which carried on a long struggle in the greatest secrecy.

465,000 Persons Were Employed In December

SALEM — There were 465,000 persons employed in non-farm jobs in Oregon in December, or 14,800 fewer than a year before, the state Unemployment Compensation Commission reported Friday.

The commission said this month's total would be considerably lower than that for December.

The December total for the lumber industry was 64,100, compared with 68,500 in Dec. 1956.

The total for all manufacturing dropped from 131,100 to 122,900, while retail trade employment fell from 87,200 to 83,100.

However, employment in plywood mills rose from 13,800 to 14,900.

The average weekly wage in manufacturing industries during December was \$81.50, a gain of \$4.40 from December 1956.

N. Y. Mansion Bought By Russ Orthodox Church

NEW YORK — A Manhattan mansion has been purchased by the Russian Orthodox Church outside of Russia.

The George F. Baker mansion at Park Avenue and 93rd St. will be used as a place of worship, will house the church's governing body and serve as a residence for Metropolitan Anastasy, patriarch of the Russian church in exile.

Indicted Leader Of Klan Planning Big-Sized Rally

MARION, S.C. — Ku Klux Klan leader James Cole, who was last seen near Maxton, N.C., was indicted by a grand jury in Marion, S.C., for planning a big-sized rally.

"We don't expect to be broken up again," Cole said at his home here. "This time there will be more Klansmen than there will be Indians and I don't expect trouble from the Indians."

Hundreds of Lumbie Indians, incensed by reports that the Klan planned a rally near Maxton Jan. 18, was intended as a warning to them against race mixing, converged on the group of about 50 Klansmen with warhorns and gunfire. No one was seriously hurt, but state police had to rescue the Klansmen and pack them off home in their automobiles.

The 33-year-old Cole — who calls himself a Southern Free Will Baptist minister — is under indictment in Robeson County, N.C., site of the meeting on charges of inciting riot. He has announced he will fight extradition.

"Klansmen from all over the South are pretty upset," Cole declared. "I've had offers of 3,000 men from Texas for another Robeson County rally and offers of men from Kentucky and South Carolina."

"It will be the greatest rally the Klan has had."

At Pembroke, N.C., Simeon Oxendine — a leader of the Indian demonstration against the Klan and son of Pembroke's Indian mayor — remarked when told of Cole's plans: "He said that, did he? Well, we'll just wait and see."

Self-Styled Attorney Advised To Learn Ethics

PORTSMOUTH, Ohio — If John Shortridge is going to act as an attorney, he'd better learn some professional ethics.

At a preliminary hearing Friday before Judge Lowell Thompson, Shortridge, 27, was acting as his own attorney on a charge of receiving stolen property.

The court gave him permission to question a witness, Donald Stillner, 20, one-time friend of the defendant.

Shortridge stepped up to Stillner and punched him in the face. Stillner, with a black eye and face cut, got some satisfaction when the judge gave Shortridge a one-year jail term for contempt of court and also bound him to the grand jury on the stolen property charge.

Negro YMCA Building Damaged By Explosion

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. — An explosion early today was set off outside the Phillis Wheatley branch of the YMCA, a community for Negroes.

Detective Capt. M. W. Upchurch said no injuries had been reported. A reporter at the scene said authorities believed the blast was caused by dynamite.

The blast shattered several windows in the YMCA, Lewis said, and tore a hole in a narrow strip of unpaved ground between the curb and the sidewalk on the side of the two-story brick building.

Police said they were checking a driver's report that he saw a black automobile speed away just after the explosion.

The blast was the second in eight days near a Negro institution. On Jan. 19, an explosion near Howard School caused damages estimated at \$1,000.

Portland Council Bans Increase In Bus Fares

PORTLAND — The Portland City Council rejected, by a single vote, a 25 cent fare for the Rose City Transit Co.'s buses Monday.

The matter was before the council on an emergency ordinance which requires unanimous approval. Commissioner Ormond R. Bean voted against the fare increase. Another vote was expected later.

Fares now are 20 cents and the company has sought the nickel addition to halt what it has called heavy losses.

This matter — which brought some 200 persons to the council chamber — was not related to Portland Traction Co. stopping its interurban runs to Oregon City although both companies are under the same San Francisco ownership.
