Sutherland Team Beats Douglas

DENVER — Frank Leahy and former Kansas coach Chuck Mather were mentioned most often Wednesday as possible replacements for Lawrence T. (Buck) Shaw as Air Force Academy football coach.
The Academy and Shaw, 60-year-old veteran of college and pro coaching jobs, came to an amicable parting of the ways Tuesday.
By "mutual consent," an Academy spokesman said, Shaw was released from his five-year contract with three years to go. He was reported to have agreed to accept one-half of his salary, believed in excess of \$15,000 annually, for the remaining years.

Roy Campanella Said Improving

GLEN COVE, N.Y. — Roy Campanella, Los Angeles Dodgers catcher who broke his neck in an automobile accident, was described Wednesday as "somewhat better and the over-all picture is encouraging."
Those words came from Dr. Robert Sengstaken who performed a four-hour, 20 minute operation Tuesday.

The top ranking Negro ball player still was paralyzed from the shoulder down, but this condition was expected to improve. Community Hospital said he had "quite a good night considering his condition."

There seemed little prospect, however, that he would swing a bat or don a mask again in major league competition.
The accident took place on an S turn here early Tuesday while Campanella was driving a rented car home from his Harlem liquor store. He was pinned in the wreckage against a pole a half hour and never lost consciousness although he was in a state of shock.

Virgil Akins Boosted In Welterweight Ranks

NEW YORK — Virgil Akins Wednesday was boosted to the top position in the latest Ring Magazine ratings of the champion-less welterweight division.
The St. Louis veteran was promoted from second to first for his second straight knockout conquest of former welterweight champion Tony DeMarco of Boston. He moved up from second in a change of positions with Isaac Logart, the sleek Cuban contender.

DeMarco was dropped from third to fifth. Vince Martiner of Paterson, N.J., advanced from fifth to third while Charley (Tomstone) Smith of Los Angeles vaulted from seventh to fourth.

Reedsport Braves Lose Game To Coquille Team

After leading most of the way, the Reedsport Braves dropped a 47-38 decision to the Coquille Red Devils, in a district 2-A-2 basketball game played on the Braves floor Tuesday.
