

166 Licensed Dairies Operating In 2 Counties

E. P. Black, Grants Pass, district representative of the state Department of Agriculture, announced that 166 licensed dairies were operating last year in his district, which includes all of Josephine County and all but the coastal portion of Douglas County. The figure comes from a list of statistics released by Black concerning dairy activity in the district in 1957. The figures were compiled by the headquarters office of the department in Salem.

Black said the total figure was broken down into 147 grade A producers, 6 grade A producer-distributors and 13 grade B producer-distributors. He said 13 producer-distributors sell milk on their premises.

Herd sizes averaged 45 head for grade A producers, 46 head for grade A producer-distributors and 12 head for grade B producer-distributors.

The largest herd numbered 241 cattle. There were five other herds with more than 100 cattle and two between 75 and 100 head. There were 23 herds with 50 to 75 head, 50 between 35 and 50, 42 with from 25 to 35 head and

24 herds with less than 25 head. Included in the district were 125 farm tanks, 88 pipeline milkers and 78 farm tank-pipeline milker combinations. All but six of the dairies used milking parlors, with 116 dairies using stanchion type parlors and 44 using parlors with raised platforms.

One dairy herd was fed and housed in a stanchion barn, while 52 were kept in lounging sheds and 49 were kept on paved cow yards.

Black said there were 175 licensed dairies in the entire southern Oregon area. In 1956, there were 187. The average herd size last year was 34 in southern Oregon compared to 32 in 1956.

Boy, Aged 7, Confesses Setting Fires In Church

SPRINGFIELD — Police said Monday they have taken into custody a 7-year-old boy who admitted he set seven fires Sunday afternoon in the St. Alice Catholic Church.

The church pastor, Father Louis Sohler, estimated damage at \$1,500. Springfield firemen were called to the church after a member of a group meeting in the building discovered flames spreading across a large curtain near the church altar.

In a short time, seven separate fires were found to be burning, some near the altar, some at the front and back of the church, and another upstairs. Firemen said curtains, cardboard poster, and other combustible items had been ignited with paper matches.

There was considerable smoke damage and the area surrounding the altar was charred, firemen said.
