Heavyweight Pat McMurtry Upset By Willi Besmanoff

SEATTLE — Irish Pat McMurtry's drive for a shot at Floyd Patterson's heavyweight crown was shunted off to a siding Tuesday night as the Irishman dropped a 10-round, majority decision to wily Willi Besmanoff of Munich, Germany.

Irish Pat, from nearby Tacoma, was rated the No. 3 contender for Patterson's crown in the latest callover by Ring Magazine but the German wasn't impressed.

Besmanoff, 189, and McMurtry, 188, spent the first three rounds feeling each other out, then Besmanoff used his ring experience to pile up points, tagging McMurtry with sharp rights to the head and stiff body blows.

Besmanoff got off his best lick in the sixth, a stinging right that put rubber in McMurtry's knees. Irish Pat stuck it out, however, until the end of the round.

The Tacoma pride clung to his strategy of a cautious attack through the rest of the fight except for a brief flurry in the eighth. McMurtry's pattern consistently was jab, jab, jab with the left, followed by an occasional right.

Afterward, Besmanoff said he had McMurtry figured out at the end of the first round.

"He tells you about his right hand," the German said. "He gets all tense-like, and you can see him almost saying, 'I throw a right, I throw a right.'"

There were no knockdowns in the 10-round scrap, which drew a turnout crowd of 5,537 and a gross gate of \$23,817.

Judge Ely Caston called it for Besmanoff 98-96 under the 10-point must system. Judge Roy Goodwin saw it McMurtry 99-95 and Referee Davey Ward had it Besmanoff 97-95.

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Pirates' Hopes Beat Local JV

After staying close on the heels of Glendale in the first half, the Roseburg jayvee basketball team dropped a 36-46 decision to the Pirates varsity squad Tuesday night on the Roseburg floor.

A cold third quarter cost the Indians the win, as they were able to connect for only five points in the period against the 14 for Glendale. Roseburg outscored Glendale, 19-15, in the fourth quarter, but the damage was already done.

Glendale took a close 13-11 lead at the end of the first quarter, behind the five points of Ray Munyon, and increased it to 37-22 at halftime, before breaking loose in the third quarter, when they ended with the Pirates out in front 41-27.

Hale, Hits Three

Ed Lorenzen and Bill Mundt did all of the Roseburg scoring in the fourth quarter. Lorenzen hitting for 12 points and Mundt for seven, but three quick baskets by Bill Hale of the Pirates put the game out of reach of the Indians, after they had crept to within six points, with three minutes left in the game.

Lorenzen was high scorer both for Roseburg and for the game with 19 points, followed by Mundt with 17. Hale topped all Glendale scorers with 11 points, but Tom Munyon and Clifford Worley each chipped in with 10 to help in the well-balanced scoring attack of the Pirates.

Roseburg hit on 10 out of 13 free throws in the game, while Glendale hit on 18 out of 22 to give both teams one of their better nights at the charity line.

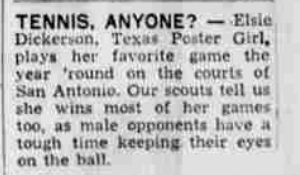

Baseball Hall Of Fame Elections Fail In '58

BOSTON — No former major league player will join baseball's immortals in the Hall of Fame this year for the first time since 1950.

Secretary-Treasurer Hy Hurwitz announced that the Baseball Writers Assn. of America failed to give any former player 75 per cent of the total vote necessary for election.

Nobody even came close. With 266 ballots cast by 10-year members of the association, 199 votes was the minimum for election.
