PCL's 154-Game Slate Released

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Pacific Coast League directors released a 154-game schedule for the realigned baseball loop's 1958 season Thursday.

One of the season openers on April 15 will be played in a new league location, Phoenix, Ariz. Phoenix replaced San Francisco's PCL entry when the New York Giants moved their National League franchise there. Phoenix opens against San Diego.

The league's new line-up includes two other new cities, Salt Lake City and Spokane, which replaced Los Angeles and Hollywood after Brooklyn moved to Los Angeles.

Salt Lake City will open at Vancouver and Spokane at Seattle. The other opener will find Sacramento at Portland.

Teams will play with seven-game series for the most part and almost all week-day contests will be played at night.

The PCL all-star game is scheduled June 30 at Vancouver.

The schedule will close Sept. 8 with Portland at Seattle and Sacramento at Spokane. San Diego at Salt Lake City and Vancouver at Phoenix close out Sept. 7.

A reserve Wednesday night helped carry Oregon Tech into first place in the Oregon Collegiate Conference by scoring the three points that pushed the Owls to a slow 39-38 basketball victory over Southern Oregon.

The teams had been deadlocked for first place prior to the game. Oregon Tech was behind 38-36 in the game's waning moments when reserve Charlie Wilson sank three straight free throws that pushed the Owls to victory.

Only a moment before Dave D'Olive sank a tie-breaking field goal that gave SOC its brief two-point lead.

Southern Oregon took only 32 shots from the field but sank half of them for a 500 percentage. Oregon Tech trailed with a 14 for 35 mark, but picked up its triumph at the free throw line.

The game was slow and deliberate as both teams used zone defenses and ball-control offenses.
