Union Pilots Postpone Strike

CHICAGO (AP) — Union pilots postponed a strike against Western Air Lines Thursday.

The walkout had been set for 11:00 p.m. (local time) Thursday night. It has been changed to 11:59 p.m. Monday.

The Air Line Pilots Assn. said the four-day delay was ordered after it agreed to a request for further conferences from the National Mediation Board.

The new conferences, under the board's auspices, will be held in Washington.

The pilots had threatened to stage annual earnings of the line's strike Jan. 19 but deferred the

walkout to permit the mediation board to attempt a settlement. Mediation talks failed to bring an agreement.

The union is seeking new contract terms covering pay, rules and working conditions and changes in the pilots retirement program.

Western Air Lines, with headquarters in Los Angeles, operates in the Far West from Mexico to Canada.

The union estimated the average annual earnings of the line's pilots is \$10,800.



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
