Cowpoke Making Strong Bid For Saddle Title

DENVER — Cowpoke George Menkenmaier of Burns, Ore., is making a strong bid for the Rodeo Cowboy Association's saddle bronc crown.

Menkenmaier, runnerup for the championship two years ago, was only 713 points behind front runner Tom Tescher, Sentinel Butte, N.D., in the latest standings.

Since the latest tabulation, however, Menkenmaier won the bronc riding at El Paso, Tex., adding 631 points to his total. Tescher did not place in his last two rodeos.

Les Johnson of Omak, Wash., was eighth by the latest standings in saddle bronc riding while Jay T. Smith, Iona, Idaho, was fourth in bareback riding. Gene Miles of Portland, Ore., held fourth place in steer wrestling.

Twenty-Game Loss Skein Broken By OCE Hoopmen

MONMOUTH, Ore. — Oregon College of Education grabbed an early lead Tuesday night and then hung on for an upset, 57-43 Oregon Collegiate Conference basketball victory over Portland State.

New Washington State Coach Signing Near

SPOKANE — The new basketball coach for Washington State College is expected to be named at a board of regents meeting Monday, board chairman Dr. Milton W. Durham said Tuesday.

Jack Friel recently announced he will retire after the season, his 30th with the Cougars.

Dr. Burham said the board usually does not receive the list of proposed personnel changes until just before the meeting opens.

He added the regents generally follow recommendations made by school officials.

Latest reported from Pullman said the field had been narrowed to about 20 applicants.

Most prominently mentioned to replace Friel were Marv Harshman, who Pacific Lutheran squad is undefeated in Evergreen Conference play, former Seattle University coach Al Brightman and Jud Heathcote, coach at West Valley High School in Spokane.

Los Angeles Dodgers Report Huge Ducat Sale

LOS ANGELES — The Los Angeles Dodgers report that they've sold 750,000 tickets for the 1958 season.

If they're all used, the Dodgers could go the rest of the season without selling another seat and still wind up with a better home attendance record than four other major league teams had in 1957.

The Giants, in New York last year, drew 651,903. The Cleveland Indians drew 722,256, the Chicago Cubs 670,629 and the Washington Senators 457,069.

Dodger business manager Harold Parrott said Tuesday that 7-250 season tickets have been sold — 6,500 for boxes and 750 for reserved seats. These represent an investment of about \$1,760,000, he said.

Advance sale receipts are more than twice as heavy as they were during any year the Dodgers were in Brooklyn.

North Carolina Tar Heels Kick Over Wolfpack, 81-69

Maybe those North Carolina Tar Heels, winning next month's Atlantic Coast Conference tournament.

After playing only 500 ball in eight games — and tumbling to 16th in the week's Associated Press rankings — the Tar Heels perked up and smacked old rival North Carolina State ranked No. 9, 81-69 last night in the Wolfpack lair.

It could be the turning point for the Tar Heels, who can still grab

a return berth in the NCAA playoffs by winning next month's Atlantic Coast Conference tournament.

North Carolina, now 16-5 overall and 9-3 in the ACC, took second place behind idle, seventh-ranked Duke in the conference while N.C. State 15-5 slipped to fourth at 9-4. Maryland, rated 14th moved into third with an 8-3 ACC record by smacking Virginia 69-56.

Tennessee, No. 30 came on in the second half for an 84-65 victory

over Georgia Tech that gained a second-place tie in the Southeastern Conference with idle Auburn and Alabama.

Texas Tech gained a first-place tie with idle Arkansas in the Southwest by whipping Texas 93-66, and Southern Methodist joined the Rice in third place by defeating the Owls 70-59. Last-place Baylor knocked off once-hopeful Texas Christian 70-64.

North Carolina, which had split two earlier games with the Wolfpack, won this one from the foul

line. Outshot 25-22 from the field, the Tar Heels earned 37 of 46 free throws, with Pete Brennan hitting 18 of 20 and taking scoring honors with 32 points.

Maryland 15-4 missed its first seven shots from the field and trailed 10-0, but had a 36-24 half-time bulge and wound up with a 400 shooting mark. Tom Young was high scorer with 19 points.

Tennessee, down 33-31 at the half, took charge early in the second half for its 11th straight home victory and a 16-4 record.
