

North Celebes Supports Rebels Of Sumatra

JAKARTA, Indonesia (AP)—North Celebes has become the first province outside Sumatra to recognize the new rebel government in Padang.

Lt. Col. Sukendro, army chief of intelligence, announced Tuesday that the North Celebes Commander, Lt. Col. D. S. Somba, had broken off relations with the central government in Jakarta and is supporting the revolutionary government proclaimed Saturday.

North Celebes had been declared an autonomous unit on Jan. 1.

Telephone connections to Menado, capital of North Celebes, were cut and the state-owned Garuda Airways suspended flights there.

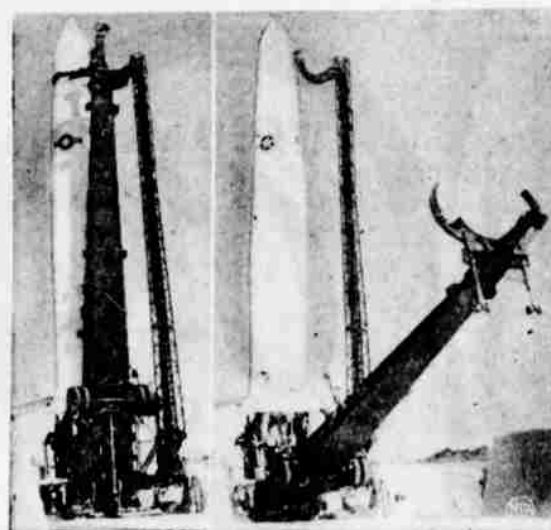

Decision On Mural Left To Art Group

PORTLAND (AP)—The Portland Art Commission will appraise a sketch artist Louis Bunce submitted as the basis for a mural in a new air terminal here.

The Port of Portland, which earlier had rejected the sketch, Wednesday told the art commission that it was up to it to re-appraise Bunce's effort. Some artists had been critical of the rejection.

The port had said the sketch, a modernistic piece designed to evoke impressions, was unsuitable for the multi-million dollar terminal.

Port members said they wanted something they could recognize.

A witness at Wednesday's port meeting, real estate man Cachot Therkelsen, said that air travelers would be shocked by works such as the one Bunce produced.

Therkelsen said, however, he expects the commission to applaud Bunce's sketch because it likes modernistic art.

Draft Horse Logging Popular With Industry

WASHINGTON (AP)—The American Forest Products Industries, Inc., says the Old Gray Mare is what she used to be once more—a working logger.

The logging association reports that the draft horse is back in the Northwest woods again pulling her load alongside the giant machines of the industrial forestry age. The horse had been pretty much pushed aside by diesels and specially equipped tractors.

The association says the forestry industry is finding that old-fashioned fits into the modern practice of tree farming because she can slip into the thick stands of young trees and do a better job in thinning operations than the machines.

Salem Judge Will Hear Kelley Case

PENDLETON (AP)—Judge George B. Duncan of Salem has been assigned to hear the Roscoe Kelley case in Pendleton.

Circuit Judge W. W. Wells previously disqualified himself in the case after arraignment of Kelley. Duncan told Wells Wednesday he would be here Feb. 25 to hear arguments on the demurrer filed by attorney Roy Kilpatrick at the time of Kelley's arraignment on a charge of improperly offering a gift to an officer.

Kelley's attorney charged the statute was unconstitutional, and that the indictment against Kelley did not set forth facts sufficient to constitute a crime.

Kelley, a Umatilla County commissioner, is charged with offering a gift of \$250 to Clifford Smick, March 22, 1957 in return for testimony that a building in which slot machines and pinball machines were stored was broken into by city police that day. Smick is a deputy sheriff and self-employed merchant policeman.

Later 140 of the machines were destroyed on order of the Pendleton Justice of Peace Court.

Kelley denied the charge.
