4 Top NCAA Contenders On Long Streaks

It's been a streaking team that has bagged the NCAA basketball championship the last three years, so today's advance tip might be to watch Temple, San Francisco, Cincinnati and possibly Notre Dame, a quartet winnin' like the wind.

Temple has a winning streak of 22 games, San Francisco 20, Cincinnati 15 and Notre Dame 10.

In 1955 San Francisco went to the tournament with 21 in a row, then swept through five tournament games to become champs. That carry-over string had been stretched to 50 when the unbeaten Dons of '56 went into the post-season scrambling. It was up to 55 when they disposed of Iowa in the finals.

Tarheels Last Year

Last year, unbeaten North Carolina won 27 straight up to national tournament time and added five more for the championship.

None of this year's already-qualified red hot blow over opponents last night, but all four managed to win and keep their streaks going.

Third-ranked Cincinnati, in the NCAA as the Missouri Valley Conference Champion, snapped NIT-bound Dayton's string at 16 with a 70-66 decision. All America Os-

car Robertson, a decoy for the first 12 minutes, stepped in to score 27 points.

Guy Rodgers, named to the Associated Press All America today with Robertson, Kansas' Wilt Chamberlain, Elgin Baylor of Seattle and Don Hennon of Pitt, fired 20 points in Temple's 58-51 victory over Lehigh. Temple's rated fifth nationally and will play in the

Portland, Raiders Meet In NAIA Final

MILWAUKIE — Portland University meets Southern Oregon at the Milwaukie High School gym Wednesday night for the District 2 berth in the National Assn. of Intercollegiate Athletics basketball tournament.

The two teams won playoff games Tuesday night, Portland overpowering Portland State 87-84 and Southern Oregon downing Lewis and Clark 85-63.

The two losers will play in a preliminary to the title game.

Ray Scott led Portland with a total of 26 points—20 of them in the first half. The Pilots led all the way and Portland reserves played the final 20 minutes.

In Tuesday night's opener Lewis and Clark led through the first period, but Southern Oregon closed the gap 32-31 at the half.

Aided by the scoring of Dave D'Olivio—who was high for the game with 31 points—Southern Oregon pulled ahead and stayed there.

Royce McDaniel led the losers with 23 points.

Linfield College Team Qualifies For NCAA

SALEM, Ore. — Jack Riley poured in 39 points Tuesday night as Linfield College qualified for the NCAA small college basketball tournament opening at Santa Ana, Calif., Friday with an 86-75 decision over Willamette University.

Linfield's first opponent in the Santa Ana tournament will be Chapman College of Los Angeles, Calif.

Linfield found the going rough against the determined Bearcats in the first half, but Riley found the range in the second half and Linfield rallied behind his scoring to win going away.

The other high scorers were behind Fred Grim's 18 to tie for the Southwest title with 9-3 records.

Baylor Nears 1957 Scoring

Just one of his better evenings could put Elgin Baylor ahead of the 826 points that earned him the Pacific Northwest collegiate basketball scoring title in 1957.

The Seattle University All American, who hit 60 points in one game and has had several 47-and-up performances, had 792 when the books were closed for the week Saturday. He was 150 ahead of Chuck Curtis of Pacific Lutheran who splurged into second place.

Baylor has at least three games left to play, one each against Idaho State and Bradley and the third against the Skyline champion in the National Collegiate Athletic Assn. tourney warmup.

Seattle's Elgin Baylor Trails Oscar Robertson

Seattle's Elgin Baylor goes against Idaho State's Rocky Mountain Conference champions Wednesday night, needing 40 points to take over the lead in his duel with Cincinnati's Oscar Robertson for the national major college basketball scoring title.

Robertson dipped three-tenths of a point Tuesday night when he scored 27 in Cincinnati's 79-66 victory over Dayton. With one regular season game remaining, he has 869 points in 25 games for a 34.76 average. Baylor, with two left, is averaging 34.55 according to statistics from the National Collegiate Service Bureau.

Both Seattle and Cincinnati have qualified for the NCAA post-season tournament and their tourney performances will count in the scoring duel.

OSC Swimmers Lose

CORVALLIS — Ardin Hills of Sacramento, Calif., Saturday defeated Oregon State College in a swimming meet here 48-36.

It was the first dual meet defeat in two seasons for Oregon State, the defending champions in the Northern Division of the Pacific Coast Conference.

USSR GAINS MEDAL

LAHTI, Finland — The Soviet Union gained its first gold medal of the 1958 World Nordic Ski Championships Wednesday as 28-year-old Alevtina Kolchina won the women's 10-kilometer (6.3 miles) cross-country race in 44 minutes and 49 seconds.

The women's skiing was the day's only event.
