Felix Brame Attributes Mental Disorder To Possible Poisoning

Under cross examination by special prosecutor Paul Geddes Thursday, Felix J. Brame said in the fourth day of his murder trial that he thinks his wife might have poisoned him.

Brame had testified earlier in the day, under examination by defense attorney Robert B. Duncan, that he believes various physical disorders with which he was afflicted last spring may have been caused by arsenic poisoning. He did not specify the manner in which he suspected he became poisoned, providing the symptoms were those of poisoning.

Questioned by Geddes, he said

he believes he was poisoned while working in tobacco fields some years ago.

Pressed by Geddes as to whether he suspected that his wife may have had a part in the poisoning, he first replied, "I don't know."

Pressed still further, however, he said, "I suspected it, yes. But I just didn't want to think so."

Tranquilizers Blamed

The defense has contended, in seeking to prove Brame innocent by reason of insanity, that severe head and intestinal pains resulted in Brame seeking relief by means of tranquilizers and narcotic-containing sodatives. The defense claims that this in turn led to his state of mind on July 10, 1957.

Brame denied that he owned the 45 caliber Army revolver allegedly used in Mrs. Brame's slaying.

Geddes handed Brame the brown-handled revolver, which has been entered as state's evidence. "Do you recall any intimacy on your part with regards to this gun?" asked Geddes.

Brame replied negatively. "Do you know how it got into

your car?" continued Geddes. "I didn't even know it was in my car," answered Brame.

Career Said "Ruined"

Geddes also questioned Brame regarding a statement he made earlier that his wife, in his opinion, had "ruined" his Army career. Brame retired as a major in 1953 after 23 years of continuous service.

Brame had said his wife's poor health — he described her as an "active tubercular" — prevented him from serving in his special field, transportation.

Asked whether he resented his wife "ruining" his career, Brame replied, "No. I didn't hold that against her. I thought it was an unavoidable situation."

Geddes asked Brame why he obtained his Army separation instead of continuing to serve at the Rocky Mountain Arsenal near Denver — his last station — where Geddes said "you (Brame) were doing your duty and your wife was getting treatment free of charge."

The defendant said that he was "doing a job they should have had a second lieutenant doing" and that he "should have had command of a battalion."

"I couldn't carry out the duty that I felt was commensurate with my qualifications," added Brame.

Shooting Not Recalled

The inevitable question had been put to Brame earlier in the day — by Duncan.

"Did you shoot your wife?" asked the barrister.

"No. Not that I remember."

"Did you plan to shoot your wife?"

"No. Not that I remember."

The Kentucky-born defendant said in his slight drawl that he did not have "the vaguest recollection" of being at the scene of the shooting.

Five other defense witnesses were called Thursday. First to be called after Brame was Sherman S. Smith, Grants Pass attorney who filed a cross complaint on behalf of Brame after Brame's wife had filed for divorce last April 24.

Smith said he first saw Brame on about May 1. Then, said Smith, he again saw Brame after the latter had returned from a month-long stay in Madigan General Hospital at Fort Lewis, Wash., in late May and June. Brame had testified that he had had three teeth removed and had undergone surgery on his lower intestines to correct a painful internal disorder while at Madigan.

Doctors Prescribe Pills

It was on prescription of doctors at Madigan that Brame said he acquired the equinol (tranquilizer), codeine and other pills and capsules.

Smith said Brame looked "considerably thinner" and was "pale, with dark circles under his eyes" after his return from the hospital.

The attorney added that Brame also was "extremely nervous" after his return.

He confirmed Brame's testimony that Brame had visited him on the day of the shooting. Smith described Brame as "badly shaken" and said he broke down into a "convulsive crying spell which in-
