Doukhobors Offer To Leave Canada For Travel Help

KRESTOVA, B. C. — The Sons of Freedom, a fanatical disrobing sect of the Doukhobors, are ready to leave Canada at once for the Soviet Union if the British Columbia government will assist in their transportation, a member of their council said today.

The statement followed a mass meeting of about 1,000 members of the sect yesterday.

A delegation which recently visited the Soviet Union reported on the trip. It was disclosed last week the Soviet government has made available two sites in Siberia.

The meeting in this Kootenay area village, 240 miles east of Vancouver, B. C., was held outdoors.

Early in the proceedings a group of 15 women in the center of the crowd disrobed. Disrobing has been a prime weapon of the Freedomites in their long campaign of passive resistance to Canadian authority.

Speaking on the subject, "A Race Without a Winner," Brees pointed out that it is part of the American scene to have winners. "If there's anything American people can't stand it's a tie."

"We would all lose," he continued, "if we penalized the aristocracy of ability."

Dulles In Manila For Allied Huddle

MANILA — Secretary of State Dulles arrived today for the annual SEATO foreign ministers' meeting, which is expected to focus on a possible linkup with similar anti-Communist alliances in the West and Middle East.

The U.S. secretary said the three-day parley, which opens tomorrow, must strengthen further the fabric of this regional defense organization.

High on the agenda is a scheme for linking SEATO with the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and the Baghdad (Middle East) Pact. The Philippines made the proposal. Britain already is opposed to it.

The ministers also will discuss the question of more economic and military aid for SEATO's Asian members.

Member nations are the Philippines, the United States, Britain, France, Pakistan, Australia, New Zealand and Thailand.

Renegade Artist Said Dying Of Tribal Curse

SYDNEY, Australia — Australia's famous aboriginal artist, Albert Namatjira, was reported slowly dying Monday from a tribal curse.

The Sydney Daily Mirror said that many people in Alice Springs, where the artist is hospitalized, believe that Arunta tribesmen "pointed the bone" at him — an ancient aboriginal method of doing away with offenders.

The bone is pointed in a special ceremony and the victim traditionally weakens and dies.

It is believed the bone was pointed at the artist because he obtained full citizenship rights last year. The tribe of aborigines opposes such going over to the white "invaders."

Son Of Drain Woman With Army In Europe

A Drain High School graduate recently participated in Sixth Infantry Regiment field training exercises in Berlin.

He is Pvt. Richard E. Joslyn, 23, son of Mrs. Golda B. Turnidge. Drain, Joslyn, a rifleman in the regiment's Company C, entered the Army in February 1957 and arrived in Europe the following November.

A 1953 graduate of Drain High School, he attended Boise Junior College in Idaho.

Billboard Control Bill Amendment Neuberger's Aim

WASHINGTON — Sen. Neuberger (D-Ore.) said Monday he will offer a billboard control amendment this week to legislation seeking to speed up the nation's roadbuilding program.

The regulation could apply only to the 41,000-mile superhighway network — the interstate system — now under construction to link up all parts of the country.

Eugene Water Board Seeks McKenzie License

WASHINGTON — Application of the Eugene, Ore., Water and Electric Board for a license to build the Carmen-Smith power project on the Upper McKenzie River was filed this week with the Federal Power Commission.

The project would cost an estimated \$19,300,000, and have installed capacity of 56,000 kilowatts. If the application is granted, the utility will discard plans for development of the Beaver Marsh project upstream from the Carmen-Smith project, said Byron Taylor, board manager.

Eugene voters rejected sale of revenue bonds to finance Beaver Marsh' after the utility was granted a construction license by the FPC several years ago.

More than a dozen witnesses, including many who battled over Neuberger's proposal last year, were called to a public hearing Monday on the billboard question by the Senate Public Roads subcommittee.

Neuberger's proposal would offer a 1 per cent bonus to states which agree to control billboards along the interstate system. This could be added on to the 90 per cent of the cost of the construction which the federal government now pays.

The proposal was beaten 7-6 in the committee last year.

The senator told a reporter he would offer this same plan as an amendment to the bill of Sen. Gore (D-Tenn.) to accelerate federal-aid highway construction.

This bill is scheduled for a hearing Tuesday before the Public Roads subcommittee, and then is expected to be reported to the Senate later in the week.

NET INCOME DOWN

SAN FRANCISCO — West Coast Telephone Co. reports net income, before taxes, of \$3,493,000 last year, compared with \$3,138,000 in 1956. The per share earnings amounted to \$1.37 last year against \$1.30 in the year preceding.

The company provides telephone service in parts of Oregon, Washington and Northern California. Operating headquarters are in Everett, Wash. General offices are in San Francisco.

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
