

Owners Of Sheep Killed By Dogs Seek Payments

Payments totalling \$1,436 are being sought by 15 owners of livestock slain by dogs on Douglas County farms during December, January and February.

Dog owners who are identified are required to pay damages. The dogs, in most cases captured by county Dog Control Officer Bob Hall, are destroyed. Costs assessed against the dog owners are \$25 in cases where ewes were killed, \$15 for lambs and \$5 for goats.

The biggest complaints were turned in by Giles Hunt, Sutherland, who reported 20 ewes killed, Bill Weaver, Myrtle Creek, 18 lambs and one ewe killed, Darley Ware, Garden Valley, four ewes and one goat and W. P. McFarland, Myrtle Creek, four ewes.

Other complaints were reported by Joe Denley, Sutherland, two ewes; Jack Denley, Sutherland, five lambs; Isaac James, Olalla, three lambs; Floyd Ramp, Ramp Road, two ewes; Harvey Dunkin, Glendale, one milk goat; Art Copeland, Winchester, one ewe; Marion Krebs, Brockway, one ewe; L. B. Atterbury, Booth Street, one ewe; Chester Howard, Tenmile, three lambs; Louis Berney, Grant Smith Road, one ewe; Morgan and Engle, Melrose, two ewes.

No Immediate Hostile Use Of Satellites Seen

SAN DIEGO, Calif. — Dr. Lee A. DuBridge says he doesn't envision any immediate hostile military use of satellites.

The president of California Institute of Technology said Tuesday night:

"I do not believe that conquest and occupation of the moon have the slightest military value or interest. Nor do I believe that satellites floating around the earth are of the slightest use, in the foreseeable future, as bombing platforms or, indeed, for carrying out any hostile act against an enemy except spying on him."

It would be easier, he added, to hit any target on earth from 5,000 miles away with an intercontinental ballistic missile than from the moon, 240,000 miles and five days missile travel away.

Dr. DuBridge spoke at the second symposium on basic and applied science in the Navy.

Rear Adm. Rawson Bennett, chief of naval research, said in an interview at the same meeting that the Navy will continue to need conventional ships and weapons in the nuclear and missile age because it would not be feasible to use weapons such as the ICBM or Polaris intermediate range missile in a limited war.

"We must have a balanced Navy," he said.

It estimates that the work will cost about \$2,900,000. The project will include construction of ammunition storage facilities and lighting systems for hangars and ramps.

Mrs. Pasut recognized no one in the crowd waiting on a pier when the American Export liner Constitution docked. She scanned faces, expecting her husband to meet her, but he wasn't there.

Jealous Husband, 75, Kills High Stepper, 87

ROCK ISLAND, Ill. — An 87-year-old woman was slain Tuesday and police said her 75-year-old husband told them he killed her because he was "jealous" and she was stepping out on him.

George J. Ostrom was charged with murdering his wife, Ella, by clubbing and choking her.

"She done it to me three or four times before," police quoted the husband. "Hard to believe that of an old lady 87 years old, huh?"

Police said Ostrom told them he attacked his wife with a heavy piece of timber as she sat at a dressing table "fixing herself up."

Ostrom summoned police after the attack. They had been married 21 years.

Pentagon To See Added Billion For Defense

WASHINGTON — The Pentagon intends to ask Congress to increase President Eisenhower's \$39,100,000,000 military budget for 1958-59 by approximately 1 1/2 billion dollars.

Secretary of Defense McElroy told newsmen, "I don't say that it is going to be more than 1 1/2 billion but it will be at least as large as the supplemental for the current year."

Congress recently authorized a \$1,300,000,000 supplemental appropriation for the Defense Department for the year ending June 30.
