WHITE SWAN, Wash. (AP)—The Warm Springs Magpies from Oregon Wednesday night steamrollered to a 128-54 victory over the Ace of Clubs of Tappan, Wash., in the third annual All-Indian National basketball tournament here.

The Magpies will tackle defending champion Lapwai from Idaho, 87-84, winner over Nepelem, Thursday night in a tilt that could decide the title.

The high-scoring tournament was opened by Neah Bay trouncing the Satus Eagles, 112-61.

The individual scoring pace Wednesday was set by Marvin Wilbur with 40 points for LaConner's Braves in an 88-74 victory over the Chiloquin Tonies of Klamath, Ore.

In other games, the Umatillas from Pendleton, Ore., overcame a 36-35 lead at the intermission to defeat White Swan 85-73.

### Rising Costs

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—The cost of San Francisco's new major league baseball stadium has climbed \$4,100,000 to roughly 15 million dollars.

Sherman P. Duckel, city public works director, said Wednesday that the newly added \$4,100,000 is needed to extend streets and sewer lines into the bay-side site.

This big cost increase — \$2,500,000 for an area loop and connecting road to the Bayshore freeway and \$1,600,000 for sewers—caused the board of supervisors to postpone hearings on stadium plans until Wednesday.

"We're not trying to sabotage or delay the stadium," Chairman Harold Dobbs of the supervisors said. "We just want to be sure we know how much the whole thing will cost."

The cost of the stadium on the 77-acre site is estimated at \$10,500,000.

## Lumber, Sawmill Workers' Council Approves Program To Seek Increases In Pay

SPOKANE (AP)—The Western Council of Lumber and Sawmill Workers unanimously approved a 1958 bargaining program Wednesday that would cost employers 31 cents an hour.

It includes a 15-cent hourly wage increase, an area-wide health and welfare program that would cost employers 10 cents an hour per worker, and additional paid holidays amounting to 6 cents an hour.

The council, holding its annual convention here, represents union workers in 11 western states.

Spokesmen said union negotiators in 1958 will seek a pension plan for members in addition to wage increases and improved vacations.

Delegates said some members of the union were granted 5-cent hourly wage increases last year but many didn't get any.

The union's executive board suggested the 1958 program.

## St. Louis Budweisers Break Team Series Mark
