## Winston Faces St. Paul's In 'Y' Hoop Final

Winston Christian and St. Paul's Lutheran moved into the finals of the YMCA Senior High Church League basketball tournament Thursday night with wins in the semi-final round.

St. Paul's Lutheran tripped Christian Church 43-32 and Winston Christian edged Latter-Day Saints 50-40 in Thursday night action in the Joseph Lane gym.

High for the losers was Vern Stoddard with 14 points, all of them on free throws, as he hit a perfect 14 for 14 from the gift stripe. The two Hatfield's, Tom and Mike, followed with eight points each.

St. Paul's took an early lead over Christian Church, and with Tom Kolberg and Jim McGhehey each hitting for six points in the first half, moved out to a 23-16 halftime advantage.

Kolberg led the scoring for the winners with nine points, but all four of the other starters had eight points each in the well-balanced scoring attack.

Bryan of Christian took scoring honors for the game with 16 points, 10 of them in the final half. The usually high-scoring Dale Yow was held to just six points by the tight St. Paul's defense.

The two winners will meet in the championship game tonight on the high school floor, with the losers meeting for third place in the week-long tournament.

Trophies will be awarded to the first three places after the games Friday night. Game time for the first tilt will be 7 p.m., with the title game scheduled to start at 8 p.m.
