De Valera Given Jeers And Cheers On London Visit

LONDON — Cheers and cries of "traitor" Monday again greeted Ireland's 75-year-old Prime Minister Eamon de Valera as he entered Westminster Cathedral to worship on St. Patrick's Day.

Scotland Yard detectives and policemen stood by. Cries of "Free the prisoners" went up from the shamrock-wearing crowd outside the big, vaulted cathedral near Buckingham Palace.

Hand-clapping and cheering were just as loud as the jeering for De Valera.

The protests came from sympathizers of the Irish Republican Army which De Valera, once its fighting commander, outlawed when he first came to power in Ireland years ago.

De Valera's government opposes the IRA's current campaign of violence to unite the Irish Republic with the counties of Northern Ireland, a part of Great Britain's United Kingdom. De Valera has interned some IRA members.

De Valera is also dedicated to a united Ireland, but his and other Irish governments of recent years favor achieving the union by peaceful means.

De Valera here on a three-day visit, also was cheered and jeered in unruly scenes in Soho Square Sunday. Demonstrators shouted for him to release IRA men held in Ireland.

Shipments Of Western Pine Up: Orders Down

PORTLAND — Shipments of western pine were up last week compared with the previous week but production and orders were down, the Western Pine Assn. said Friday in its weekly report.

All three categories were below the figures for the same week last year.

Orders last week were 71,814,000 board feet, compared with 75,493,000 the previous week and 83,230,000 for a comparable week of last year.

Similar comparisons: production 74,254,000 feet; 77,853,000 and 82,470,000; shipments 67,378,000 feet; 79,368,000 and 82,084,000.

Shipments and orders for 1950 are 1½ per cent behind last year at this time. Production is up 3 per cent.

TAX GATHER UPPEd

SALEM — State tax collections in the eight months ended Sept. 30 totalled \$1,000,000, or about 4 million dollars over the similar period a year earlier, the tax commission said Monday.

Personal income tax receipts were \$62,707,908, a gain of 5 millions. Corporation excise tax totals were \$11,695,188, a drop of one million.

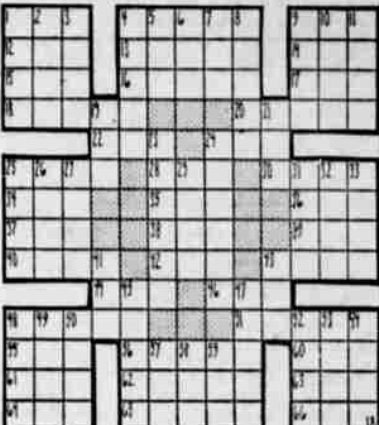
