

# Umpqua Savings, Loan Building Nearly Finished

New, Modern  
Structure Cost  
Is \$130,000

The new, modernistic Umpqua Savings and Loan building on the southeast corner of the Jackson Street-Oak Avenue intersection in downtown Roseburg was turned over by the contractor and architect for inspection by company officials Tuesday afternoon in preparation for a proposed grand opening on about April 15.

Construction of the \$130,000 building began last Oct. 15 after the old building was torn down last summer. Stanley Hermann, manager, said movement of equipment into the structure probably will begin next week. He said total evaluation of the building, including furnishings and equipment, will be about \$140,000.

General contractor for the job was Murphy Construction Co., while Lyle Glenn handled architectural work.

The rear one-third of the structure will be occupied by the law offices of George Luoma and Don H. Sanders.

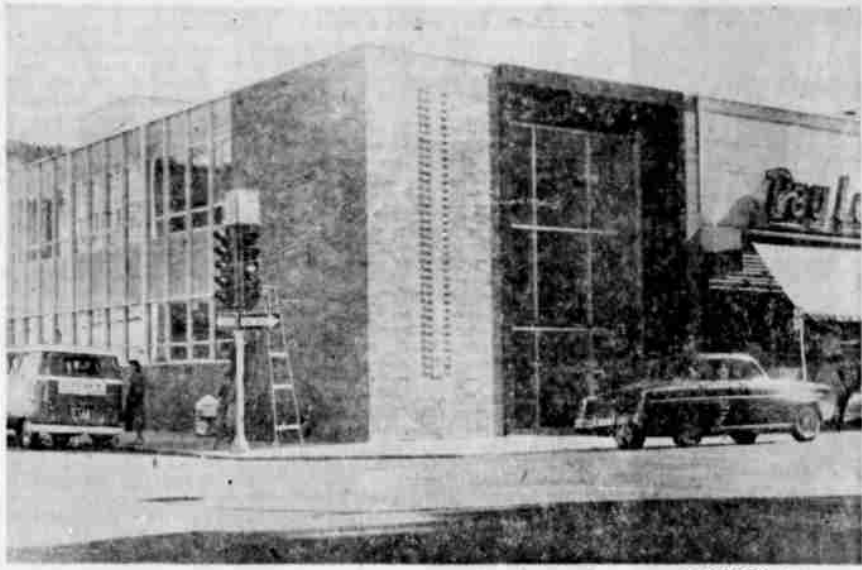
Designed For Comfort  
Hermann said the structure is designed with employee comfort first in mind. A modern kitchen, complete with refrigerator, a range, and a luxurious lounge area on the balcony attest to this.

The spacious business office features vinyl plastic tile flooring and pastel green plastic wall surfaces with vertical-grain fir paneling on the back wall and the front of the balcony. The ceiling is constructed of soundproof plaster and tile. Cabinets and counters are made of birch.

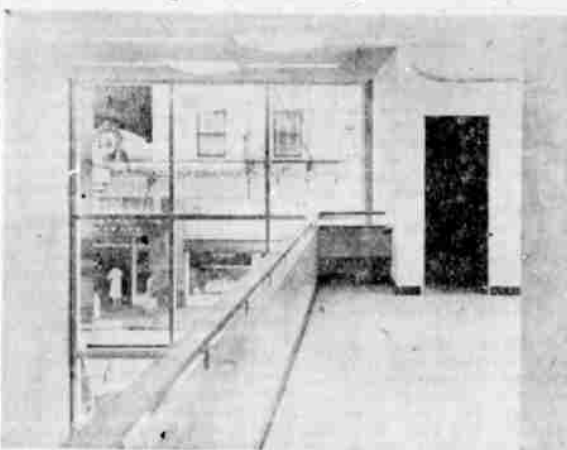
A planter inside the large front window and a colorful potted tropical plant in the rear lend an informal atmosphere to the office.

Hermann's office is located at the front corner of the downstairs area, while the balcony houses the president's office, the employees' lounge and kitchen and a store room.

The building will be air-conditioned and heated with hot air from an oil-fired boiler in the basement, said Hermann.

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## President Says He Won't Be Panicked By Alarmists

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower declared Tuesday his administration will undertake any measure, including tax reduction if necessary, "that will assist healthy economic recovery."

But he said it isn't going to be "panicked by alarmists" into activities which could make the present recession hardships of business and individuals chronic instead of temporary.

The President's remarks were prepared for a conference of some 1,800 Republican women.

In them, he hinted at a veto of a bill the Senate passed last week to freeze price supports on farm commodities.

He said that "freezing rigidly the price-depressing practices of the past represents in my opinion a 180-degree turn in the wrong direction — the direction that can only lead to chronic controls and perpetual troubles for the farmer."

Eisenhower's address touched also on a variety of other subjects.

On the point of conduct in government, Eisenhower mentioned no names, but said that the standard of official conduct "must be the highest standard known to human behavior."

The greater role and the responsibility of government, he said, the greater the importance of "uncompromising insistence on the highest official standards, all the time, everywhere."

A House investigation of the Federal Communications Commission has resulted in the resignation under fire of FCC Commissioner Richard A. Mack. The same subcommittee only Monday questioned Mrs. Eisenhower's brother-in-law, George Gordon Moore.

The chief executive also put in new plugs for support for his foreign aid and trade programs, saying that "peace is at the stake."

## Jaycee Travels By Mule To National Convention

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — A reckless young Jaycee, bitten by his own scheme, set out Monday on a 2,000-mile ride to Los Angeles astride a mule named Kate.

Robert Bradley, 24, a restaurateur and president of the suburban Raleigh-Bartlett Jaycees, will be the state Jaycees' official ambassador to the national convention June 16-19.

He dreamed up the gimmick as a joke after hearing that the state Jaycees' theme would be the "frontiersman." Fellow Jaycees pushed the project and elected Bradley as the rider.

The trek will take 87 days, Bradley figures. Since the state Jaycee convention neglected to set aside any money for the venture, food and lodging for Bradley and Kate will depend on local Jaycee chapters en route.
